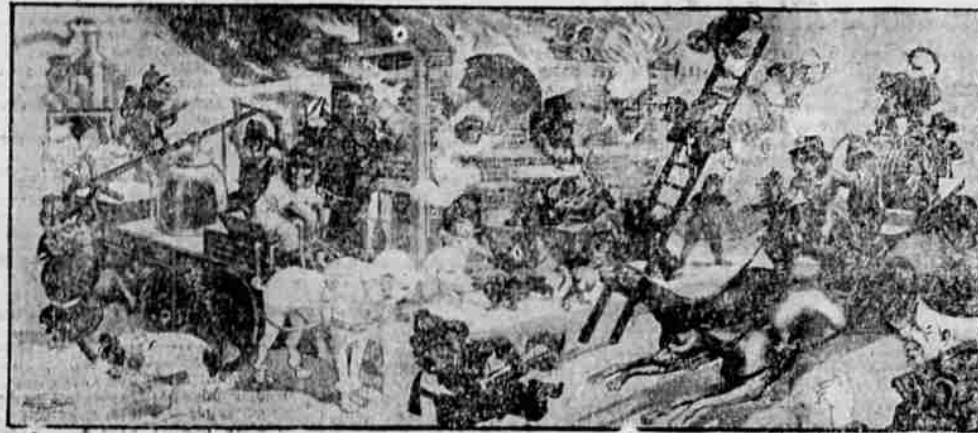
UNIVERSITY IS WATCHING WATER BOND ELECTION

STUDENTS ALMOST TO A UNIT WANT TO SEE PURE WATER—NONE DRINK ANYTHING BUT WELL OR STERILIZED WATER WHILE IN EUGENE

The University is watching the municipal election closely, and the students almost to a unit want to see pure water. Hardly an outside student dares drink anything but well or boiled water, and many of them believe that that protects them from typhoid.

In the last two years probably one hundred and fifty students have been driven away from Eugene on account of fear of water.

Many of the old students here during the awful epidemic never returned, and will never come back or ad-

vises any one to come to Eugene until after pure water is assured. Just how many freshmen have been compelled to stay away is open to conjecture. One year ago, however, it is likely fifty were not in attendance who would otherwise have been. This year there is no doubt but that some, though a smaller number, were driven by fear of the water to other institutions. In the future if an epidemic should occur it would mean desertion by a hundred of the old students, almost depopulating the University.

The faculty and management of the college have this fear constantly in mind, for all the water drawn on the campus is sterilized and placed in jars throughout the buildings. The common question among new students is: "Is the water boiled?"

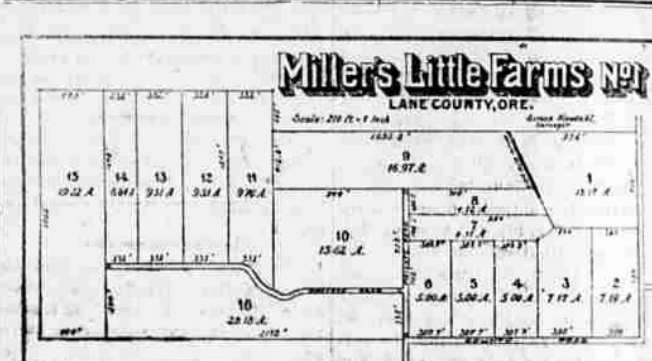
