CRUSHED ROCK CAPACITY WILL BE DOUBLED

ANOTHER CRUSHER ADDED TO
WARREN CONSTRUCTION CO.'S
PLANT.

BOTH CRUSHERS WILL BE RE-
MOVED TO QUARRY AND SEPA-
RATE ENGINE WILL OPERATE
MIXING PLANT, WHICH WILL
BE IN OPERATION NEXT WEEK

The Warren Construction Com-
pany is busy at work setting up the
big paving plant which recently ar-
rived here from Boise, Idaho, and
which has replaced the smaller one
in operation here all summer, the lat-
ter having been removed to Salem,
where the company has a contract to
pave several blocks of streets. The
superintendent in charge of the plant
stated this morning that he thought
the new plant would be in operation
some time next week.

With the new plant came a sec-
ond rock crusher which will be placed
in operation within a short time,
thus doubling the rock output of the
plant. The old crusher and the one
which has just arrived will be re-
moved to the quarry on the west
slope of the butte and they will be
operated side by side by the engine
which is now operating the old
crusher. Another engine is being set
up with which to operate the bitu-
lithic mixer.

A good-sized force of men is kept
busy all the time at the quarry and
crusher and a great deal of rock is
piled up on the grounds ready to be
placed on the streets. When the mix-
er does start up and everything is
ready to again begin actual paving
there will be no scarcity of rock, as
was often experienced during the
summer. When the two crushers get
to running the crushed rock pile will
grow just twice as fast as it does
now.

It is probable that some paving
will yet be done on the new contract
this winter, although the wet weath-
er will interfere greatly. The work
can be done in good weather only,
and it is not probable that there will
be many weeks together during the
winter without rain. As soon as the
rains have ceased in the early spring
a large force of men will be put to
work and the new contracts will be
rushed to completion.

ALL STEEL MAIL CAR IN USE ON S. P.

An all-steel mail car, a type of the
very latest improvement in mail car
construction—is in use on No. 16, the
early morning northbound overland,
a few days ago. Railroad men say
there are only about four of these
cars in use in the United States, the
first one only recently being turned
out of the shops. The car is built
almost exclusively of steel, practical-
ly all of the wood used in its con-
struction being the small wooden
bars which protect the windows. It
is lighted with electricity, and carries
its own dynamo, and besides the sys-
tem of lighting and included in its
equipment is an electric cook stove
for the convenience of the mail
clerks. The car measures about 70
feet in length and weighs 60 tons.
