MINISTERS START CAMPAIGN FOR LOCAL OPTION

NEARLY EVERY PASTOR IN EUGENE SPOKE ON SUBJECT AT YESTERDAY'S SERVICES

STATEMENT MADE BY ONE MINISTER THAT MEN HAD GONE ON JURIES IN LIQUOR CASES IN EUGENE DETERMINED TO HANG THE JURY OR FREE THE DEFENDANT

The ministers of Eugene have declared war upon local option law breakers, and yesterday started a campaign to create public sentiment in favor of the strict enforcement of the law. Nearly every minister in the city spoke on the matter to their congregations, and expressed themselves as disgusted with certain boozers that have been made, namely, that more liquor is now sold in Eugene than before Lane county "went dry."

One minister said that the deputy district attorney and other officers were willing to back the law, but that the public sentiment in the community was such that when there was no doubt about the guiltiness of a party, the defendant in the case would be cleared. The same minister scored certain business men severely, and said that they were digging into the earth after gold, and cared nothing for the moral welfare of the community. Others he praised. He also said that men had gone on juries in liquor cases determined to hang the jury or free the defendant. He said he had attended the trials and considered some of the verdicts a disgrace.

The addresses to their congregations yesterday was the first gun fired in the campaign by the ministers for civic improvement and more strict enforcement of the local option law.

In regard to the idea of pastors taking a hand in such a campaign, one minister said that a few years ago a minister did not dare to speak on a question dealing with politics, but that now it is generally recognized as his duty.
