L. N. RONEY COMPLETES THE LOWELL BRIDGE

The county wagon bridge across the Willamette river at Lowell has been completed and contractor L. N. Roney and his force of men have returned to Eugene. The bridge is said

to be one of the best in the county, and will be a great convenience to the people residing along the upper river. Heretofore they have been compelled to cross the river on a ferry boat and half of the time during the winter months the ferry has been out of commission on account of high water and travelers have had to go many miles out of their way to cross the river.

WATER BOND ORDINANCE PASSED BY COUNCIL
SPECIAL MEETING OF CITY FATHERS HELD LAST NIGHT FOR THAT PURPOSE
BONDS ARE TO DRAW FIVE PER CENT INTEREST AND ARE TO BE IN DENOMINATIONS OF NOT MORE THAN \$1000 NOR LESS THAN \$100

The ordinance providing for the issuance of the \$300,000 water bonds was passed by the city council at a special meeting of that body last night. The bonds are to draw five per cent interest semi-annually, and the principal payable in gold coin, to be negotiable, with interest coupons, to be in denominations of not more than \$1000 nor less than \$100. These bonds are to run 40 years from January 1, 1908, and are to be redeemable in any amount at the option of the city council at any interest period subsequent to January 1, 1922. The notice for bids is to be published in the Guard and Register. The date for opening the bids was fixed for January 6, 1908. The council is given authority to engrave and make out said bonds and sell as many of same as are needed to carry out the purposes for which the bonds are issued.

Other Business Transacted.
A petition for grading and graveling University avenue between East Fifteenth and East Eighteenth streets was presented and granted, and an ordinance ordering the improvement from East Thirteenth to East Eighteenth street passed.

A petition to have the sidewalk on the west side of Lincoln street north of the railroad track repaired was referred to the street committee, with power to act.

A. C. Guthrie was appointed to take the place of W. T. Campbell on the committee for assessing damages and benefits on the opening up of Olive street.

License on Hotels, Etc.
An ordinance providing for licensing bottling works, inns, hotels, restaurants or soft drink establishments or other similar places where food or drink is sold or supplied, and also to regulate the same, the license fee to be \$2 per annum, was introduced. The ordinance was for the purpose of putting them under police authority. The bond for bottling works and hotels is fixed at \$500, all night restaurants at \$250, and all other classes of business at \$100. The ordinance was read twice and laid over until next meeting.
