DR. I. D. DRIVER DIES AT HIS FARM ATTANGENT

EMINENT METHODIST MINISTER. MANY YEARS A EUGENE RESIDENT. EXPIRES

WAS AGED OVER 83 YEARS AND WAS AN EARLY PIONEER OF OREGON, COMING ACROSS THE PLAINS IN 1853—WAS ONE OF BRAINIEST MEN IN METHODIST MINISTRY

Rev. Isaac D. Driver, one of the most eminent ministers on the Pacific coast and for many years a resident of Eugene, died on his farm near Tangent, Linn county, Wednesday afternoon, October 30, 1907, at 1:30 o'clock, after only a week's illness, although he had been in failing health for some time past.

Dr. Driver was born at Fort Wayne, Ind., August 27, 1824. He was the seventh in a family of twelve children, and was educated in Indiana. He worked for the government when quite young, carrying the mails between Fort Wayne and South Bend on horseback through a country infested with treacherous Indians and where there were no settlements for miles. After leaving school he engaged in farming and stock raising, and in 1848 he was married to Miss Rebecca Crumley, who survived him a year, leaving one child, Samuel M.

In 1849 Dr. Driver crossed the plains to California, where he became engaged in mining and met with considerable success. In 1850 he left San Francisco via the Isthmus of Panama, and arrived in Indiana again after a few weeks and re-engaged in farming. In 1852 he married Miss Mary Harlanbrook, and in the fall he joined his father and brothers with their families, and prepared for the trip to Oregon. Dr. Driver's mother died on the way and many of the cattle and horses perished from the all-day water on the plains. The party landed in the Willamette valley in September, 1853, and the next month they took donation land claims in Douglas county.

Dr. Driver then engaged in farming and stock raising until he was taken very sick with fever and nearly died. Reviewing his life and the promises he had made to his mother he realized that if he were spared his life he would devote the rest of it to the ministry. As soon as he was able he began the study of Latin, Greek and Hebrew and entered with zest upon the work which he had been inclined to ever since he had been ten years of age. In 1857 he began preaching in the Umpqua valley and the next year he joined the Oregon conference and was first assigned to the pastorate of the Methodist church at Jacksonville, followed by Eugene, Corvallis, The Dalles, Oregon City and other prominent churches.

In 1867 Dr. Driver was again bereft through the death of his wife, who left five children. He again married in Eugene in 1871, Miss Leanna Hies, who survived him seven months. He was married again in Michigan to Miss Anna Northrup, and returning to Oregon was appointed presiding elder of the Salem district. In 1875 death again entered the family, removing his wife, who left one child. In 1877 he was married to Miss Mary E. Williams.

After having served as pastor of numerous Oregon churches, as presiding elder of the Salem and Eugene districts and on numerous national boards, having made several trips to the East, he purchased a farm of 125 acres on the outskirts of Eugene, where he and his family resided from the early '80s up to a year or two ago, when he sold his farm to F. L. Chambers and bought another at Tangent, Linn county. Dr. Driver was elected to the Oregon state senate from Lane county on the Republican ticket about ten years ago and served one term. He was a man of strong personality, and was considered one of the brainiest men in the Methodist ministry. He was a Mason and held numerous offices in the local order. To the end he remained active in mind, though enfeebled in body. He leaves a wife and fifteen children, besides numerous grandchildren. The children living are as follows:
