Word was received in Eugene today that the construction force on the Oregon Electric railway would connect that portion of the Portland-Salem line which is being built south from Portland with the southern end of the line which has already been completed from Salem north to Chemawa, Saturday, and cars will at once be operated between the metropolitan and the capital city over the line. The company has received part of its rolling stock and many more cars are on the way to Portland from the East. The track is one of the best ever built in Oregon and the electric trains from the outset can make fast time.

**MARRIAGE LICENSES
MAY BE ILLEGAL**

PERSONS TAKING OUT LICENSES DURING GOVERNOR'S HOLIDAY DOING SO AT OWN RISK

According to the opinion of County Clerk Lee, couples who contemplate marriage this week are in a number of cases postponing the event owing to the quietus placed upon all legal transactions by the action of Governor Chamberlain in declaring five legal holidays.

Although two marriage licenses were issued by the county clerk's office yesterday, there is some question as to their legality, and it is not improbable that some couples who procured licenses in Oregon during this week, will obtain a second license in order to be safe. All couples who obtain licenses from the office here this week do so at their own risk as there is a question as to their legality. With the understanding that the licenses may not be issued, County Clerk Lee is willing to issue licenses to couples who desire to take the risk involved of getting a license during the holidays. While such marriages would probably never be questioned unless the parties should some day come into court to obtain a divorce where large property rights were involved, it is possible that a legal tangle might result. Marriages are solemnized on Sundays and legal holidays, however, and licenses are issued on Sunday by placing on them the date of the previous day.
