CLEARING HOUSE CERTIFICATES WILL CIRCULATE HERE

BOOTH-KELLY COMPANY WILL PAY \$25,000 IN WAGES WITH NEW MONEY.

MEMBERS OF MERCHANTS' PROTECTIVE ASSOCIATION AGREE TO ACCEPT THE PAPER AS CASH—IT BECOMES REDEEMABLE ON THE FIRST OF FEBRUARY NEXT YEAR

The Eugene Merchants' Protective Association held a meeting last night at which time the Booth-Kelly Lumber company announced that it would pay \$25,000 in wages during the next few days in San Francisco clearing house certificates, it being unable to secure the cash from the banks to pay off their several hundred employees who have been laid off pending the betterment of conditions in the money market and the settlement of the freight rate matter. After a general discussion, the merchants agreed to accept this paper as cash from the employees, and hereafter it will be in general circulation here. The certificates are redeemable on the first day of February, 1908.

This is the same kind of a medium of circulation that is being used in Portland at present and which is being taken there as cash until the banks are opened for business again. Other matters pertaining to the present financial uneasiness were discussed at the meeting last night. It was the general opinion that there was no cause for alarm and a feeling that everything would come out all right and that normal conditions would prevail pervaded the meeting.

MADE MANY TRIPS TO IOWA AND BACK

Lara Nelson and wife have recently returned to Eugene from Iowa and will hereafter make Eugene their permanent home. They have made a number of trips back to their former home in Iowa during the past several years, intending to remain there, but each time they have returned to Eugene, and finally have come to the conclusion that this city is the best place after all in which to reside. They first settled at Albany, several years ago, and then came to Eugene, where they bought a home. They went back to Iowa but soon returned to bought a place on South Willamette street and built a fine house there. They will erect a third residence still further south on Willamette street and intend to remain there during the rest of their lives. Mr. Nelson is aged 80 years and his wife only a few years younger. They are the parents of Andrew Nelson, formerly owner of the electric light plant at Cottage Grove.

FIELDS SAYS DEPOT WILL BE BUILT

MAY BE SOME DELAY IN BEGINNING WORK, BUT NOT VERY LONG

SUPERINTENDENT OF HARRIMAN'S NORTHWEST LINES ACCOMPANIED BY HEAD PHYSICIAN AINSWORTH IN HOSPITAL CAR MAKES VISIT TO EUGENE TODAY

L. R. Fields, superintendent of Harriman's Northwest lines, accompanied by Dr. F. K. Ainsworth, head physician of the company, arrived in Eugene early this morning in the superintendent's private car, "Call the new hospital car which was built in Iowa." Accompanying the car was less than a year ago for use on the coast lines of the Harriman system. The trip was made here for the purpose of showing Dr. Ainsworth over the lines, this being his first official trip through this section of the Northwest. He was taken up to Wendling and back this morning and the party left for Roseburg on the afternoon train.

Superintendent Fields was interviewed by a Guard reporter at the depot this afternoon. When asked if the recent order stopping all construction work in the Northwest included the new depot in Eugene, the superintendent replied that it might delay the beginning of the work a short time, but he thought not long, as the company fully intends to build the depot, the business here demanding it at once.
