LADD AGREES TO MAKE GOOD TO DEPOSITORS

Portland, Nov. 9.—In a signed statement to the Associated Press tonight William M. Ladd, head of the firm of Ladd & Tilton, bankers, who is a large stockholder in the defunct Title Guarantee & Trust Company, says he will guarantee the savings bank depositors in that institution to be paid in full within two years from date, and as a representative of the W. S. Ladd estate, which is back of the Ladd & Tilton bank, will relinquish to the general creditors of the Title Guarantee & Trust Company, securities which they hold for the debt of \$607,000 due to Ladd & Tilton. Mr. Ladd's statement is in part:

Mr. Ladd's Statement.
"While I have not participated in the Title Guarantee & Trust Company I am desirous and willing to protect the savings bank depositors of that institution, numbering, as I am advised through the press, several thousand people and representing a total deposit of some \$495,000. To such depositors I hereby guarantee payment on or before two years from date of approval of the respective claims."

Mr. Ladd then described the manner in which this will be done. He says this much is a personal matter with him, and has nothing to do with the firm of Ladd & Tilton. Behind this bank is the entire Ladd estate, he says, and thence making public his whole intentions regarding the
