RECEIVES A SCORE OF 184 OUT OF A POSSIBLE 200, BEATING COMPANY K, OF PORTLAND, BY ONE POINT—COMPANY C, OF EUGENE, GETS SIXTH PLACE

A couple of weeks ago The Guard stated that it was reported that Co. A, O. N. G., of this city, had received a higher marking than any other company in the state on the showing made at the annual inspection conducted by Inspector-General James Jackson last spring. The report was proven correct by the receipt of the general orders from Adjutant-General Finzer, dated November 2, and received by Captains Babb and Willoughby, of Companies A and C respectively, yesterday. Company A has a score of 184 points out of a possible 200, Company K, of Portland, which has heretofore been the crack organization of the state, falling to second place with a score of 183. Company C, of Eugene, won sixth place with a score of 167. Company A, of Eugene, second, ranked fourth in the state and has always ranked well up in the list of top notchers. Every member of the company, from the captain to the private in the rear ranks, has striven faithfully to make a good showing at these annual inspections, and for several years past the company has had an attendance of 100 per cent, some of the members traveling many miles to be present at the inspection so that the company's record in this respect would be clear. They have received as a reward for their loyalty the honor of being ranked the most efficient company in the whole Oregon National Guard.

**CITY'S STREET SWEEPER ARRIVES HERE AT LAST**

The street sweeper ordered by the city authorities more than a couple of months ago and for which tracers had been sent out in order to locate it, arrived last night and will at once be set up and placed in commission. It is said that it will operate nicely in wet weather and will sweep up the mud on the pavement just as well as it does the dust and trash. The machine is a four-wheeled concern with a big rotary broom about eight feet long and two feet in diameter, and will be operated by two horses, the fire team. As soon as it is set up the team will be hitched to it and the disagreeable mud, which is caused by the accumulation of dirt and other material in the absence of any kind of systematic sweeping, will be gotten rid of.

The sweeper was purchased from Chas. Hyman & Company, of New York, and was shipped on September 25. The freight on the machine was \$80.62.

The sweeper was set up and given a trial on Willamette street late this afternoon.

**BANQUET AT BAPTIST CHURCH LAST NIGHT**
