DAIRY HERDS

**TO BE OFFICIALLY
EXAMINED**

STATE VETERINARIAN HAS
BEEN HERE AND FOUND TUBERCULOSIS IN ONE HERD

FIVE OUT OF 38 HEAD OF COWS
WERE AFFICTED AND OWNER
ORDERED TO KILL THEM--EVERY COW IN EUGENE WILL BE GIVEN TEST IN NEAR FUTURE

Dr. C. J. Korinek, state veterinarian, has begun an investigation of the condition of the dairy herds in the vicinity of Eugene and he has found that in at least one dairy tuberculosis had existed among the herd. The doctor arrived up from Salem Tuesday and in company with Dr. J. Christie, the local veterinary surgeon, made tests at N. Mikkelsen's dairy two miles south of the city. Out of 38 cows examined five were found to be afflicted with tuberculosis and they were condemned. The owner promised to kill them at once. There are 87 head of cows on this dairy and the remainder will be examined at a later date.

Dr. Korinek returned to Salem last evening, being compelled to go on account of business matters there, but will return in a short time and examine the herds at every dairy that furnishes milk to the people of Eugene. He will endeavor, if possible, to stamp out the disease among the cattle of this vicinity, if he has the co-operation of the citizens in the matter.

It is proposed to examine every cow that is kept in Eugene, in addition to those in the dairy herds, and each one that is found to be diseased will be condemned and ordered killed.

The attention of the Commercial Club has been called to this matter and it was discussed at the meeting the other night.

STRONG SERMON
