HUNTER AND JENSEN APPOINTED LIEUTENANTS

Company C, Fourth Regiment, O. N. G., held a meeting last night at which time Captain Willoughby announced his choice for first and second lieutenant. Second Lieutenant Henry H. Hunter was named as first lieutenant and to fill the vacancy made by his promotion, Sergeant Lawrence Jensen was named as second lieutenant. They will be examined in due time and will receive their commissions within a few weeks.

Lieutenant Hunter enlisted in Co. C, Second Regiment, O. N. G., in the spring of 1894, and rose to the rank of sergeant prior to the breaking out of the Spanish-American war, being discharged when his company was mustered into the volunteer service. He again enlisted in Co. Fourth Regiment, O. N. G., July 31, 1898, and was made a sergeant. He was appointed second lieutenant of Co. C, O. N. G., in 1903, and has served continuously with the company since that time and has been an efficient and popular officer.

Sergeant Jensen enlisted in Co. C, First Separate Battalion, November 9, 1903, and was made a corporal in May, 1905. Promoted to the rank of sergeant in January, 1906.

The drive that reached Coburg consisted of between 4,000,000 and 5,000,000 feet and about the same amount was left up the river because it was too low to bring them all down. It is claiming a good deal to say that there has been new ideas evolved in this class of popular entertainment, but the claim is certainly substantiated in "The Royal Chef," which Alan Dale, the well-known New York critic, pronounced as "bright, cheery and enticing."
