quiet as on Sunday, and quieter than
it has been seen on some Sundays.
The stores and shops all closed their
doors at noon, an idyllic might as
well have closed early in the fore-
noon, as there was very little busi-
ness transacted.

new home and spoke admiringly of
our splendidly paved streets, our up-
to-date stores, our modern electric
cars, but after all, the one thing he
referred to more than any other was
the superb surroundings of our city.
Mr. Hartog's Portland Speech
At a recent banquet of the Port-
land Commercial Club, Mr. Hartog
was one of the speakers. He said in
part:

"Now, since I was engaged to come
to Eugene, I have made a nuisance
of myself buttonholing everybody I met,
asking about Oregon, and to my utter
amazement and delightful sur-
prise, I heard nothing but good.
Even a Californian told me that the
summers in the Willamette valley
were the most delightful on earth.
"While enroute to Portland last
Sunday there was no such thing as
reading, for from daybreak to sun-
set I was hypnotized watching the
beautiful country. Thus far the most
enjoyable trip in my memory was
along New Zealand's fern-clad moun-
tains, but Sunday I discovered a trip
which beats even that."

"As we approached Ashland we
came past such beautiful orchards
and lovely farms that I had to admit
that this was the first time that the
beautiful Pacific coast pictures I
had revolved in my Chicago lay before
me in reality, in all their glory and
beauty."

"And as I quizzed people all along
the line, nobody had a bad word or
even an insinuating remark to offer.

Everybody I spoke to seemed a boost-
er. The Ashland man made me
taste the splendid water at the sta-
tion and spoke in glowing terms of
Eugene. The Rogue river resident
answered my questions by saying
that the Willamette valley was a gar-
den spot. The passengers told me
about Portland's beauties, and the
Portlanders tell me about Eugene's
up-to-dateness."

"What an awakening! Where do
you get that spirit? How do you
foster it? Is it not delightful to have
the people of your state all boosting
their whole state? It is one of the
most convincing inducements for a
newcomer to stay here."

"Think of what persistent adver-
tising will do among a people who are
so willing to help your boosting."

"I have come across people here
who asked me whether Eugene was
east or south and how far Eugene
was from Portland. I guarantee
that they will know all about Eugene
before many moons. Others I have
met are not sure whether there is a
State University at Eugene or not.
Think of the possibilities for adver-
tising not only among the Eastern
and European people, but right here
among our Portlanders."

"I was at luncheon today at your
University Club. Was there any pic-
ture of your splendid University? No
sir! I went to buy some views of
Oregon scenes, but in several places
visited could not find any views of
Eugene nor of your own State Uni-
versity. We'll change all that. My
word for it. I realize that in order
to make the University known I will
have to start right at home, right
here. And when I get you Portlan-
ders interested and proud of what you
have in Eugene, just think of the
help your co-operation will be to my
work."

"Now you go abroad and tell of
your magnificent location, your
wonderful park, your fine drinking
water, but I hope to see the day when
you will all talk about the one thing
you are all interested in, one thing
you should all be proud of and help
advertise by words of praise, and that
is the University of Oregon."

"And then your beautiful valleys.
Is it not peculiar that a man, inter-

ested as I am in advertising, should
live to my age and not know of the
beauty of these valleys until Sunday,
November 10th, 1907?"

"If we can put the facts before the
people east of us, aye, even across
the Atlantic ocean, how can they but
feel a desire to come here and help
build up an empire in beautiful Ore-
gon?"

"In all the world I tell you in all
sincerity I have not feasted my eyes
on any such scenes as I beheld in
your valleys. The only difficulty I
see in the way is how to impress on
others that which I feel."

"My advertising campaign in the
Sacramento valley resulted in bring-
ing people clear across from Europe,
bound directly to the little town of
Colusa. And we can bring them
much easier to Lane county, for if
my newcomers are half as enthusias-
tic as I am, they will bubble over
with anxiety to have their friends
come, too."

"And as they will all come to Port-
land first, it behooves us to secure
your co-operation. We need you. But
you also need us. If through the Or-
egon Development League we could
erect a museum of exhibits at your
university depot, it would keep many a
traveler from going across the line
into California."
