HOTELS WILL DO AWAY WITH BUSES

GUESTS WILL RIDE TO AND FROM TRAINS ON STREET CARS—SPECIAL CAR WILL MEET ALL TRAINS

While A. Welch, manager of the Portland, Eugene & Eastern railway, was in the city yesterday, W. F. Osburn and J. M. Stark, proprietors of the Hoffman House and Hotel Smeede, respectively, made a contract with the company wherein the latter agrees for a stipulated sum per month to carry the hotel guests and the guests' baggage to and from the Southern Pacific depot, and the guests of each house will ride in the cars, paying their fares, or walk. This will do away with the free bus which each hotel has maintained for years. The new arrangement will be a saving for the hotels and will make more business for the street car company.

A special car will meet all trains, day and night, stopping at both hotels each way. Besides being a convenience for the hotels, this special car will accommodate many people living along the route of the car line who would either have to walk home at night or hire a carriage to take them there. The change will go into effect on the 15th of the present month.

Mr. Welch while here stated that the car track would be extended a few feet further north at the depot grounds so that passengers for the hotels would not have to walk any distance in the rain and mud to reach the cars.

MAYOR MATLOCK GIVES FIGURES ON WATER PLANT

In regard to the statement of A. Welch, manager of the Willamette Valley Company, made in an interview and published in The Guard last evening, concerning the sale of the water plant to the city, in which it was said that the company's and the city's engineers had agreed upon a price but the city council thought it too high, Mayor Matlock this morning gave out the following statement:

"The city agreed to make an invoice of the plant with the company's engineers. The engineers agreed upon the price of such a plant when new, and the figure was something like \$112,000, but the city's engineer invoiced the plant in its present condition at about \$92,000. The company wanted to add its real estate holdings in connection with the plant, which would bring their price up to something like \$150,000. The city's engineer estimated that the proper price at present, with the real estate included, would be \$110,000. Then the company wanted a premium of about 15 per cent. There is the difference and the matter rests right there. All negotiations are stopped and I do not know whether or not they will be resumed soon."

RAISE FLAG WHEN WARSHIP FLEET STARTS

The following circular has been received by W. S. Moon, commander of Camp Hawthorne, United Spanish War Veterans, of this city, from headquarters at Boston, Mass.:
