COMMERCIAL CLUB BOARD HOLDS MEETING

GOVERNORS DISCUSS HORTICULTURAL MASS MEETING AND FREIGHT OVERCHARGE ON HOUSEHOLD GOODS.

A meeting of the board of governors of the Commercial club was held last night. The meeting was held principally for the purpose of acting on the proposition of holding a mass meeting early in January under the auspices of the Lane County Horticultural society and the Commercial club, as discussed at the meeting of the Horticultural society last Saturday. Manager Hartog was instructed to invite him to attend the next regular meeting of the club, which will be held on January 14.

JUVENILE SOCIETY NEEDS PRUNING

REV. O. C. WRIGHT TOLD OF SOME OF THE EVILS OF THE PRESENT DAY IN HIS SERMON SUNDAY NIGHT.

The Juvenile Society of Eugene needs pruning, and so does the adult society, if Rev. O. C. Wright was correct in his observations at the Baptist church Sunday night. Mr. Wright swore his allegiance to some old-fashioned ideas concerning the conduct of young people and believed that society of today is largely responsible for producing young people who are unduly conceited, having too little respect for their elders, for sacred places and things and for time-honored customs. This tendency to push ahead our young folks weakens their characters, lays a frail foundation for real life and destroys the free, happy period of childhood. The oversight of older persons should be insisted upon. To permit young people to picnic and have social functions without these safeguards is perilous. Too much attention is allowed between opposite sexes, and the habit of pairing off and insisting on regular companionship is silly and too frequently degrading. The whole tendency is toward producing smart instead of wise people; of lowered ideas rather than splendid purposes, and to be popular rather than profoundly earnest. Young people should correct the tendency, society may help, but if neither of these assist them, fathers and mothers should assert their rights as controllers and compel a change. Use the knife and prune off society these unprofitable and harmful conditions.
