**REPORTS OF
SCHOOL CLERK
AND CHAIRMAN**

Chairman Osburn of the school board read his report at the school meeting, Tuesday evening, as follows:

Eugene, Or., Dec. 17, 1907.
TO THE TAXPAYERS OF SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 4, LAKE COUNTY, OREGON.

Ladies and gentlemen:

At the close of the school year, 1906 and '07, there were employed in this school district 38 teachers at a salary of \$2086.72 per month. This was found to be entirely inadequate at the opening of the schools the present school year.

Both grades and high school were overcrowded and more rooms and more teachers had to be provided. Every vacant room in the high school building was filled up, and even this was not sufficient after the second month of school.

The board canvassed the city for some suitable room, but being unable to find anything suitable, were compelled to erect a one-room portable house in the most crowded district—the Geary.

Bids were advertised for, and three were received, the lowest being that of Soren Jensen for \$45.00.

The contract was awarded to him, and in a very short time he had the building up, and ready for occupancy. This room opened on the 20th of November, 1907, with Miss Bertha Abel, a recent arrival from the east, as teacher.

We now have 12 teachers in the high school as against 10 last year, and 28 in the grades as against 25 last year.

One teacher each of drawing and music and one superintendent—in all 43 teachers, at a monthly salary of \$2524.91.

More room and more teachers will yet have to be provided. The enumeration of all the children in the district between 4 and 20 years of age in the district has been recently made and the number is 2118, as against 1947 last February, when the last enumeration was taken, and of this number 335 are enrolled in the high school as against 292 last year.

(The enumeration at present is 2115, a number being added since Chairman Osburn made out his report.)

1166 are enrolled in the grades, as against 993 last year. The assessed valuation of the district for 1907 is \$3,728,685.00 as against \$3,564,890.00 last year.

A transient officer, Mr. J. O. Bristol, has been appointed by the board, whose duty it is to see that every child of proper age is attending some school. We are pleased to report that very few cases have been brought to his attention.

Extensive repairs to the buildings were necessary prior to the opening of the schools last fall. At the Geary school an entire new heating plant was installed, and the building re-floored throughout, and at the Patterson school the heating plant was enlarged and very much improved.

The cost of these repairs, together with the new buildings erected is in the neighborhood of \$5000. For a detailed statement of same, and other expenses, you are referred to the report of the clerk of the board.

Military drills one hour each week have been inaugurated, also domestic science, both of which are required to be taught. Bonds have been redeemed to the amount of \$1100 during the year, or \$4600 in all, leaving the bonded indebtedness of the district \$55,400.

We estimate that \$25,000 will be

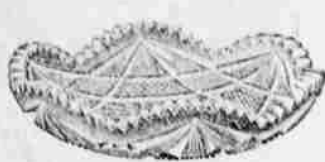

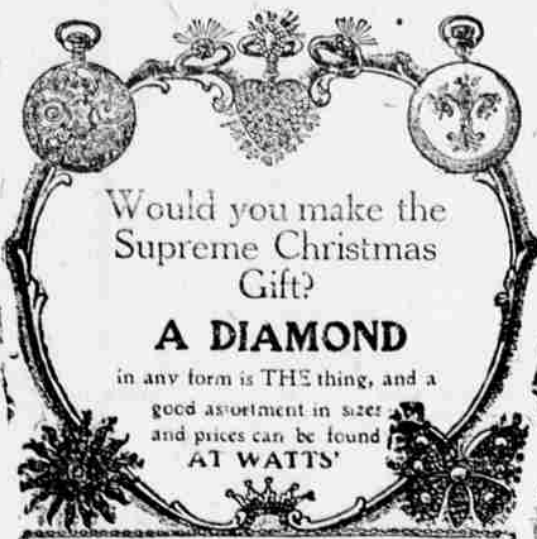
