We, your Board of Directors of the Public Library of said city, beg to submit to you our report of our said trust for the year commencing December 1, 1906, to the date herof.

The present members of said board with the dates of the expiration of their terms of office are as follows: T. H. Hendricks, L. T. Harris and G. R. Christman, September, 1907; H. L. Bogart, Darwin Bristow and H. L. Bogart, September, 1909; F. W. DeBary, Prof. E. Dunn and F. J. Berger, September, 1910, and the present members are: B. A. Paine, vice president; H. A. Bogart, secretary.

The regular employed, working force being Mrs. A. Little, librarian, at a salary in accordance with the resolution of said board, under date April 5, 1906, providing \$100.00 as a minimum and \$50 as the maximum monthly salary; Miss Elma Hendricks, assistant librarian, at \$40.00; Mrs. J. L. Clark, at \$30.00; and Miss M. Gray, janitor, employed at a monthly salary of \$15.00.

BIDS FOR WATER BONDS SOLICITED

Sealed proposals will be received by the common council of the city of Eugene until 7:30 o'clock p. m. of January 21st, 1908, at which time in the council chamber in said city said council will open and consider such proposals for the purchase of the whole or any part of an issue of \$200,000 water bonds of said city.

These bonds will be issued in denominations of \$100 to \$1000, will be payable principal and interest in gold coin, will bear date January 1st, 1908, will be due January 1st, 1948, with an option in the city to pay the same or any thereof at any interest day subsequent to January 1st, 1922, and will bear interest at the rate of 5 per cent per annum, payable semi-annually.

The bonds are issued under authority of an act of the legislative assembly of the state of Oregon, entitled, "An act to incorporate the city of Eugene and to repeal all acts and parts of acts in conflict herewith," filed in the office of the secretary of state February 15th, 1904, as amended by the initiative bill filed in the office of the secretary of state July 1st, 1907, and approved by the voters of said city at an election held October 14, 1907.

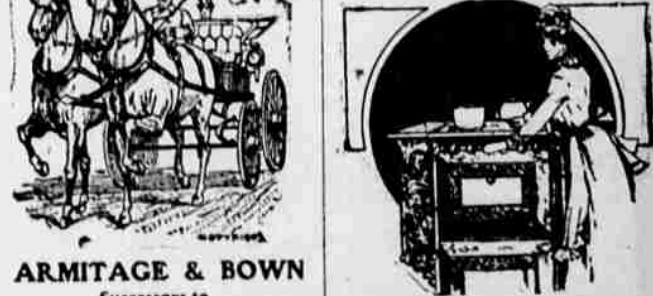
