Owing to an understanding with the Christian and Methodist churches, who are to hold meetings in January, the meetings of the Presbyterian and Baptist churches, with J. W. Brown, D.D., pastor, have been postponed until February.

Harvey Scott, a member of the Second Oregon regiment of volunteers in the Philippines, and a brother of E. J. Scott of the First National bank of this city, is with the United States fleet that has sailed for the Pacific. He is a member of the band on the battleship Albatross.

The First Christian church of this city over a year ago secured Dr. Martin, one of the strongest men in the ministry of that denomination, to begin a series of revival meetings here, beginning the first of the year. He will begin them on January 3, coming here from Albany, where he has been in a meeting for a couple of weeks. Dr. Martin is from Seattle.

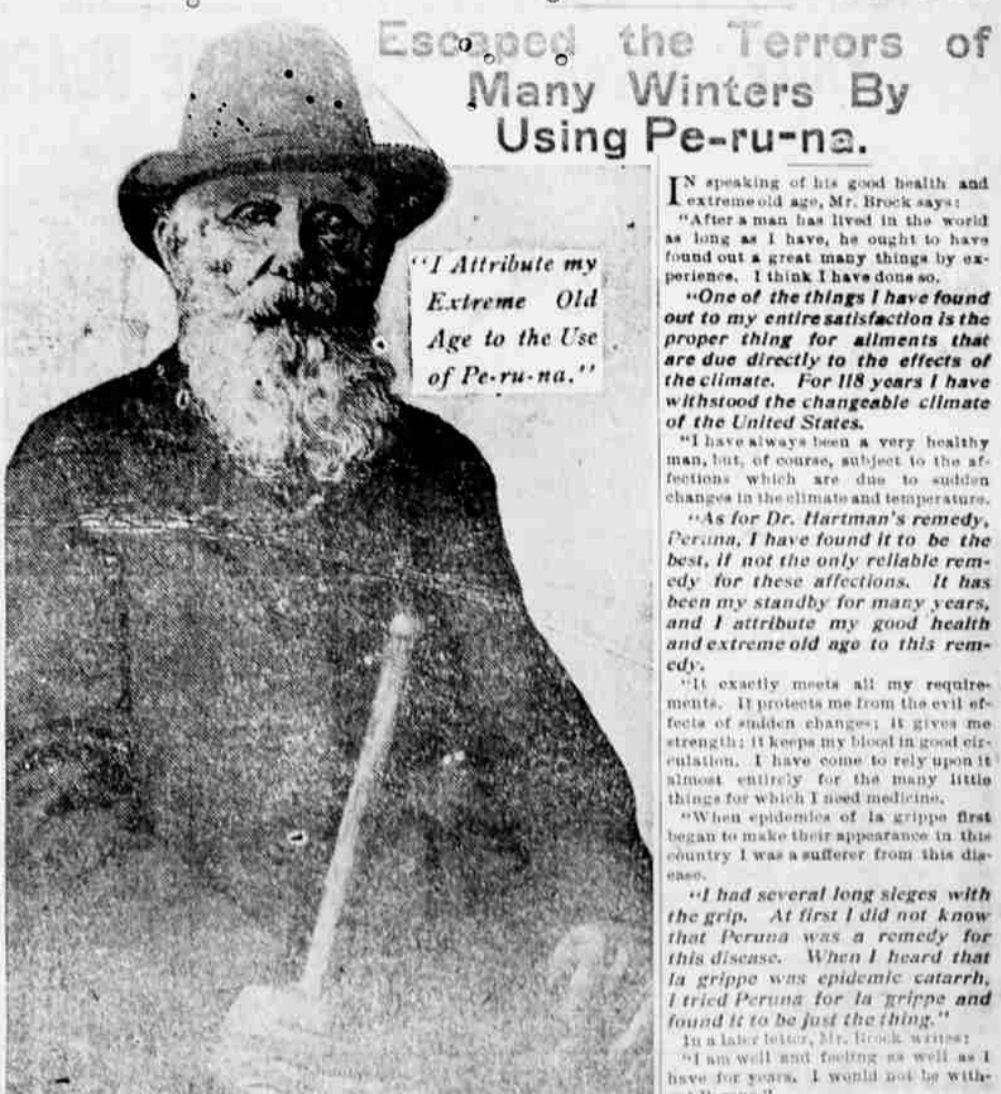
