MONEY ORDER FORMS STOLEN
AT SEATTLE AND THIRTEEN
CIRCULATED THERE.

Shirley Fred Clark has received the
following circular, which is published
for the benefit of Eugene and Lane
county merchants:

CAUTION
U. S. Money Order Forms Stolen—
Merchants Should Beware and
Not Cash Them.

Office of Post Office Inspector, Seat-
tle, Wash., Dec. 14, 1907.
Postmaster, Sir: Money order
forms have been stolen as follows:
Seattle, (Station No. 15) Wash.,
Nos. 35,033 to 35,200.

Seattle, (University Station),
Wash., Nos. 29,104 to 29,200.
These orders fraudulently filled
out are likely to be presented to
merchants and cashed generally on
Saturday evenings after postoffice is
closed. Small purchases are made,
change received and party disap-
pears.

Look out for a man about 45
years old; 165 to 170 pounds in
weight; smooth shaven; full, ruddy
face; brown hair; full American or
Canadian voice; acts like a store
clerk.

Caution your merchants. Give in-
formation to police, sheriff and
peace officers.
