RURAL CARRIERS CANNOT MAKE THEIR ROUNDS

UNCLE SAM'S MAIL DELAYED BY
HIGH WATER ON THREE
ROUTES OUT OF EUGENE

A good many people residing on the three rural free mail delivery routes out of Eugene will not receive their Christmas mail for a day or so for the reason that the high water prevented the carriers from making a complete trip on their several routes. The carrier on route No. 2, which leads through Fairmount and Springfield, could go no farther than Judkins' Point, No. 1's carrier, who goes down the river road and out on the prairie west of the city, had to turn back soon after he crossed the railroad below the city and crossed over to the prairie road and delivered a part of the mail. The carrier on route No. 3 went about 8 miles and also made a cross-country trip and delivered on the latter end of the route. A bridge or two on his route have been washed away.

The stage from Mapleton came through last night, but encountered a great deal of high water. Just this side of Mapleton the driver had to take the mail packs out and swim the horses, while the passengers elbowed around by the mountain side.

Today's stage is not expected to arrive at all, as the water is much higher out that way today than yesterday.
