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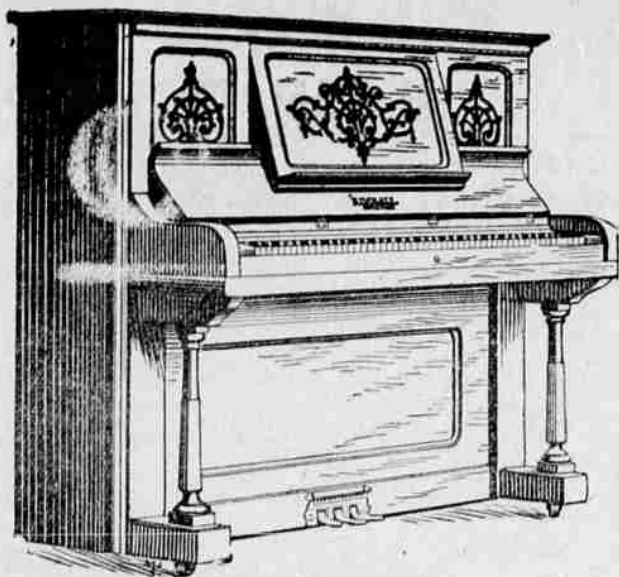

Just now the company is waiting for the proper ballasting of the road before running cars.

In connection with it is an interesting fact that cars are to be made in Albany for the road, and may be done in the C. & E. car shops. C. W. Sears & Sons have a contract for some of the window frames. All of which makes interesting reading. If there is not a unity of ownership there certainly seems to be a combination. The fare over these roads should be about half that of the railroads.—Albany Democrat.
