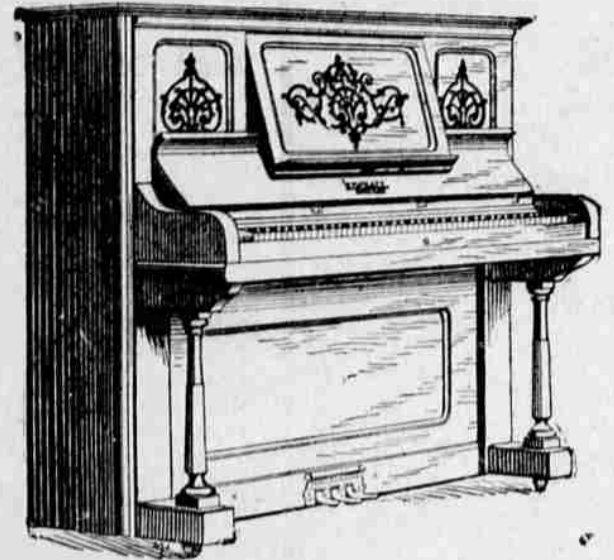

## GRANDMA DAVIDSON CELEBRATES BIRTHDAY

Halsey, Or., Dec. 31.—Children, grandchildren and 26 great-grandchildren assemble yearly for the birthday of Mrs. Sarah Davidson, who yesterday was 83.

Quite a remarkable woman is this pioneer of 1852. She does her own housework, and belongs to that now small school of housekeepers which prides itself on not having a speck of dust from cellar to garret. She is as young appearing as many women 30 years her junior. She is also a woman of good works and a giver of many alms.

Mrs. Davidson held the attention of all in the room yesterday as she told of pioneer times, how she, her husband and six children started from Indiana for Oregon in 1852 with two yoke of oxen and one cow. One child died at St. Joseph, another took cholera and for days lay in his mother's arms with no sign of life except the fluttering of his pulse. Through all this they dared not stop but must keep on with the train because the Indians were hostile. Once they were called upon to defend themselves from a band of 600 redmen. They reached The Dalles in seven months, where their cow died, which was no small loss in those times. They did not see a house between St. Joseph and The Dalles. They came to Halsey and took up land near here, where they lived until Mr. Davidson's death, 14 years ago, since which time Mrs. Davidson has lived in town. There were among the most prosperous farmers of this vicinity.

Besides the grandchildren and great grandchildren who yearly celebrate Mrs. Davidson's birthday are her children—Mrs. Lucretia Murphy, of Corvallis; Theodore Davidson, of Eugene; Mrs. Mary Cunningham, of Lebanon, and William Davidson, of Brownsville.
