EUGENE COMMERCIAL CLUB ADOPTS RESOLUTION AT RECENT MEETING

RAILROADS ADVERTISE CALIFORNIA IN DAILY NEWSPAPERS OF EAST, BUT NEVER MENTION OREGON, WHICH HAS AS MANY ATTRACTIONS

At a meeting of the board of governors of the Eugene Commercial Club, held January 6, the following resolution was adopted, and ordered sent to the officials of the Southern Pacific and Union Pacific Railroad Companies:

"Whereas, The Southern Pacific Company, Union Pacific Company and their connecting lines are doing such splendid, persistent and costly advertising in the daily newspapers of the big Eastern cities, urging people to go to California; and

"Whereas, The writers of those advertisements seem to be entirely unaware that California's sister state, Oregon, has attractions as to mild winters and sublime scenery equal to and in many instances surpassing California; and

"Whereas, Many people who have no intention of again going to California might be induced to visit beautiful Oregon, thereby adding to the revenues of the railroad companies, and to the upbuilding of our state, to the mutual benefit of Oregon and the railroads; be it

Resolved, by the Eugene Commercial Club, of Eugene, Oregon, that the railroad companies above named be respectfully urged to give to Oregon at least a share of the publicity which is now so lavishly bestowed by them upon our sister state exclusively."
