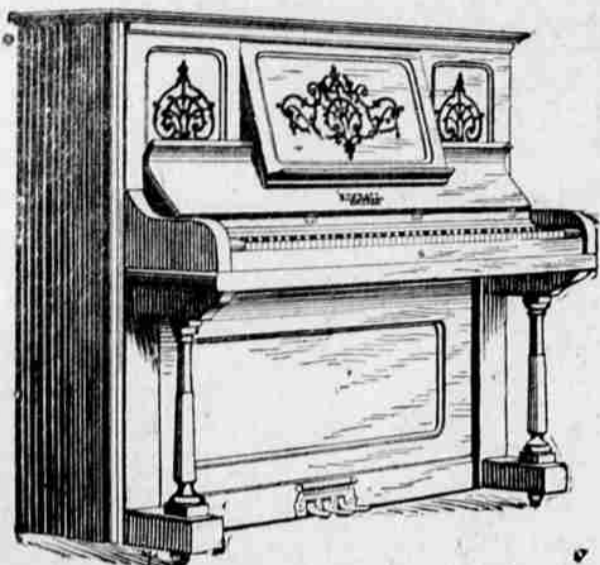

EPISCOPAL MINISTER TABOOS REVIVALS

WALLA WALLA DIVINE GETS FUNNY OVER IDEA OF TOO MUCH RELIGION BEING WISE THAN NONE AT ALL

Walla Walla, Jan. 8.—Rev. Andreas Bard, a poet and dramatist of considerable reputation, a well-known speaker all over the Northwest for his eloquence and power, and rector of the St. Paul's Episcopal church of Walla Walla, has created a sensation unparalleled in ecclesiastical history of the Pacific Northwest, when in reply to a request for an interview on the subject of revivals, for a Walla Walla paper, he jarred the brethren in his church by declaring his unqualified opposition to them as an Episcopalian. The subject of the advisability of the old-fashioned soul storming revival has recently become a mooted one in Walla Walla, and the cause of considerable acrimonious debate.

Bard declared: "Everybody knows that Episcopals stand in awe of revivalism. It is easier to imagine Bismarck wearing a Jacobine's cap or Carrie Nation managing a variety show than to see the august congregation of St. Paul's occupying a mourner's bench in the tabernacle. To the majority of the Episcopals there is but one thing worse than no religion, and that is too much religion. Talmage, Spurgeon and Moody were specialists on the geography of Gehenna, and crowded the auditorium. The Unitarian ground while the Episcopal denomination manages to keep alive by social prestige and frills of fashion. For successful evangelism, give a shouting hell fire preacher with a P. T. Barnum appendix.

"I will say for my flock, however, that they have a pretty church, good intentions, empty benches, classic music, fine millinery, no objection to smoking, no wandering boy tonight, and a clergyman willing to be a scapegoat."

THE TUTTLE ROAD LAW IS UPHOLD.

Salem, Ore., Jan. 7.—The Supreme court today upheld the validity of the Tuttle road law, in the case of St. Benedict's Abbey vs. Marion county. The decision of Judge Gallaway was reversed and the case dismissed. The suit will be carried to the United States supreme court. Other opinions were handed down as follows:

City of Eugene vs. Lane county; city awarded tax levied by county for road purposes.

State vs. Taylor and Traut, appellants from Baker county, reversed.

Eldridge vs. Hofer and Zorn, appellants from Marion county, reversed.

Robinson vs. Robinson Cheese Co., appellants from Tillamook county, dismissed.

State vs. Bartlett, indicted jointly with S. A. Gardner, appellants from Baker county, reversed and new trial ordered.
