DEATH OF W. R. DILLARD, OREGON PIONEER

CROSSED PLAINS TO CALIFORNIA IN 1850, COMING TO OREGON TWO YEARS LATER

W. R. Dillard, a Lane county pioneer, died at his home at Goshen January 12, 1908, of old age. He was born June 3, 1831, in Knox county, Tenn., and was married December 8, 1853, to Miss Alaura Hendricks, who survives him. To them six children were born, one dying in infancy. Those living are as follows: Mrs. Julia Bishop, of San Francisco; Mrs. Tamsy Hampton, of Baker City, Ore.; U. W. Dillard, of San Diego, Cal.; and F. B. Dillard, of Goshen.

After coming to Oregon from California in 1858, Mr. Dillard and wife settled at Goshen, where they continued to live until his death. Mr. Dillard was a member of the United Brethren church for many years.
