## OREGON WON FROM ASHLAND SCORE 41 TO 8

The University of Oregon basketball squad defeated the Ashland Athletic club last night at the Armory by the score of 41 to 8. The first half stood 8 to 7 in favor of the home team, but in the second half the score mounted rapidly.

Hathaway on the second pass in the game landed a basket. A foul gave Ashland their first point. Van Scoy, then Charman, followed by Hathaway with the last one for Oregon made the score at the end of the half 8 to 7.

Ashland thought they would win when they went into the game the second part of the contest, and the first five minutes followed without any more scoring. Loosely rebounded Stevenson, who was not in very good form, at center, and while he did but little basket throwing himself, the team got its eye in a short time, and in the last fifteen minutes piled up the big score. Ashland's only point in the second half came on a foul, made the last moment in the game.

Moore and Van Scoy put up a splendid game, and while the Ashland guards watched them closely, they made four and three baskets respectively. Dick Hathaway, in his customary fashion, made the most baskets of any individual. Dick Charman played a steady game at guard; Farrington being sick. There is not much to choose between these two clever men. Strong played guard for two minutes and made a basket. Soles, the Ashland guard, was very fast, and Howe did remarkably well. Robertson and Herndon, at forwards, did not play consistently. Spencer, the center, worked like a horse the whole game, his fault being roughness.

## FORBES, WEST POINT COACH, MAY BE HERE

Rumor around the University states that the matter of coaches for next year will be settled tomorrow. It seems that there is some doubt as to the choice, the selection laying between Coach Chase, who did so well with the second team, and Forbes, of West Point, who was let out last fall.

Forbes was an all-American man for two years at Yale, and knows the Eastern game to perfection. Those who want to see Chase come out at the head of the game here say that Forbes would be only an experiment, while Chase's ability is well known. Among other offers is one from Coach Place, of Washington.

In regard to the Yale man the Portland Journal says: "With such a man as Forbes working with the Oregonians it is believed the greatest team in the history of the college can be evolved. Heretofore the coaches, with the exception of Dick Smith, the former graduate who captained Columbia University, have been from the Middle West. Sometimes they have been successful, but not always, it being apparent that they are not so well acquainted with the highest development of the game as the men from beyond the Alleghenies.

"It will take a pretty sum to secure a man of the ability of Forbes, but football paid well last year and bids fair to grow in public favor next season. If the State University secures the Yale man or any coach from the big Eastern colleges then it deserves to be complimented on its progress. A touch of Yale football direct from the seat of learning would be welcome here in the Northwest."
