## KING CARLOS AND SON SHOT BY REVOLUTIONISTS

Lisbon, Feb. 1.—King Carlos and the crown prince, Louis Philippe, have been assassinated. Three persons who committed the murder were killed on the spot.

The royal family were seated in an open carriage in which they had just returned from the villa Vicosa, where they had been sojourning. At the corner of Praca de Commercio and the Rue de Arsonal a group of men suddenly sprang toward the carriage, and leveling carbines which they had concealed upon themselves mortally wounded the king and crown prince and slightly wounded the king's second son, Prince Manuel. Queen Amelie, who rode in the carriage and tried to shield the crown prince, was unhurt.

The king and the crown prince, upon whom the attack was directed, were each shot three times and they lived just long enough to be carried to the marine arsenal, near by, where they expired. Almost at the first shot the king fell back on the cushions dying and at the same moment the crown prince was seen to half rise and then sink back into his seat. Queen Amelie jumped up and threw herself toward the crown prince in an apparent effort to save his life at the cost of her own, but the prince had already received his death wound.

The police guard fired upon the assassins and killed two of them. The third is believed to have committed suicide after he was placed in jail. A strong guard was in attendance because of the recent uprising in the city and the discovery of the plot to assassinate the premier, Franco, and overthrow the monarchy. But the band of murderers had selected a most advantageous spot for the commission of the crime, for they were concealed from the eyes of the party until the vehicle had come into the Praca de Commercio, the large square.

Before any of the guard was aware of what was happening, the assassins had leaped to the carriage and instantly the fusillade of shots rang out. In a moment all was a terrible confusion, the king and crown prince being shot down without the slightest chance to save themselves. The police guards sprang upon the ringleaders, the number of whom is somewhat uncertain, killed two of them and captured a third, who is believed to have committed suicide.

It is charged that one of the murderers was a Spaniard. The bodies of the king and crown prince were removed from the arsenal in the two closed carriages to the royal palace. An examination of the wounds of the king showed that three bullets had reached their mark. One wound is situated at the nape of the neck, a second in the shoulder, and the third, which was the fatal wound, severed the carotid artery.

The crown prince, who was still breathing, but who died almost immediately after his admission to the arsenal, has suffered three wounds in the head and chest. Two bullets had struck Prince Manuel.

News of the assassination swept through the city like wildfire through dry grass, and tonight half the population is panic stricken, not knowing where the next blow may fall. There is the greatest dread for the future of the country, which seems to be on the verge of being plunged into the throes of revolution with all its horrors of bloodshed. Throughout the city consternation reigns and all houses and business places are barricaded.

The cold blooded murder has sent a thrill of horror throughout the country even among those who have been working politically for the establishment of a republic, and sorrow is expressed on every hand at the dreadful end of the king and crown prince. At first blush it would seem as though the assassination was the work of anarchists and not of the republican sympathizers. Nevertheless the stirring events of the past week have prepared the public for some startling culmination. The discovery of plot after plot, as well as the discovery of many secret stores of weapons and ammunition has demonstrated beyond peradventure the existence of a determination on the part of a large body of the Portuguese to overthrow the present conditions and proclaim a republic. The tragedy occurred about 5:30 in the afternoon, but the panic which instantly gripped the city and all its activities, prevented all lines of communication and it was not for some hours that the news of the assassination was permitted to be sent broadcast.
