It is supposed that she died from heart trouble, caused by her fall and rapid descent down the stairs. Mrs. Toothaker was aged 72 years. The funeral was held Monday with interment in the Laurel Grove cemetery. Rev. E. J. Emmons conducted the services.

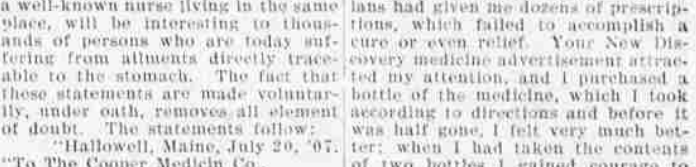
