Will Retire From The Local Retail Field

We have already closed several stores in Oregon; others are to be discontinued at once. Within three weeks every instrument in stock here must be sold. We are therefore going to close them out right where they stand. We shall take what we can get for them cash, checks, or interest bearing contracts.
