**SALEM LADS WIN A FAST AND FURIOUS GAME—FINAL SCORE 29 TO 22**

In a very exciting game the boys of the Salem high school snatched a victory from a seeming defeat Saturday night. Eugene started the scoring and marked up nine points before Salem marred the tally sheet. At the end of the first half the score was twelve to nine in favor of Eugene. The second half was even faster than the first. With but five minutes to play and the score 19 to 19, Salem took a decided brace and scored five field goals in rapid succession. The final score was 29 to 22 in Salem's favor.

Eugene played good ball during the entire game and it was only Salem's terrific finish that caused their defeat. They are a clean set of players; are game losers.

G. Watson, Cockerline and Bean were the best players for Eugene, while Salem found they had five stars: Roberts played a fine game, getting four field goals and eight fouls, making sixteen points. Jones played a fine game at center. Dolly Farmer played a steady game and got two baskets. Uter played a good game at guard, holding his man to two baskets and getting one himself. Minton did good work in breaking up the passing.

This victory raises Salem to second place. Next Friday they meet the Roseburg team, who have as yet met with no defeats. **LEFT WIFE AND LARGE FAMILY OF CHILDREN**

**JUNETTE BAINBRIDGE ALLEGES THAT HER HUSBAND DESERTED HER AND THEIR OFFSPRING**

Mrs. Junette A. Bainbridge Saturday afternoon filed in the circuit court, through her attorney, C. A. Wintermeier, a complaint, asking for a divorce from her husband, William H. Bainbridge. She alleges that they were married in Rock county (now Brown county) Nebraska, on March 1, 1885, and have the following minor children: John James, aged 20 years; Fannie Elizabeth, 17; Maggie Mary, 15; Myron Henry, 11; Sophia Eliza, 9; Florence Nellie, 6; and Frankie Raymond, 19 months. Mrs. Bainbridge alleges that on April 29, 1906, her husband willfully and without cause or provocation deserted her and has since failed and neglected to contribute anything for her support or for the support of the children; that since that time she has been compelled to work to support herself and some of the children.

She asks for the custody of the children and for \$10 a month alimony, besides \$25 for her expenses in the suit.
