CITY COUNCIL TRANSACTS LARGE AMOUNT BUSINESS

HARRY GRAHAM APPOINTED NIGHT POLICEMAN IN PLACE OF W. G. WHITE—SALARIES OF POLICE OFFICERS RAISED TO \$45 PER MONTH—OTHER IMPORTANT MATTERS

The regular meeting of the city council was held last night at which a large amount of business was transacted. All members of the council were present except Gilbert. After the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting and the allowing of the usual large number of current bills, the finance committee reported favorably on the increase of the salary of the city treasurer from \$25 to \$30 per month, and it was carried. The matter of providing a room for the treasurer was referred to the finance committee and the mayor, the general understanding being that the room occupied by the fire department in the city hall will be used.

examine the reservoirs twice a week was passed.
W. T. Campbell asked for a permit for a building, partly of galvanized iron, in the rear of the building occupied by David Link, and the matter was referred to the fire and water committee.
The petition for grading and graveling West Seventh street three blocks west of Blair street, was referred to the street committee.
A petition for a sidewalk on South Ferry street was also referred. A petition for Westward extension of CEKAL street for straightening the west line of South Charnelton street was also referred.
A petition for abolishing the quarry on the west side of Skinner's butte, stating reasons therefor, was referred to the judiciary committee.
The matter of vacating an alley and substituting another in lieu thereof by J. J. Rude in his plat was agreed to, if it could be satisfactorily arranged with other property owners.
The resignation of W. G. White as night policeman was accepted and Harry Graham was appointed in his stead. His appointment was confirmed.
The street committee reported 13,498 feet of lumber used last month. Calkins moved that there be no jump-off from the sidewalks to the crossings of the side streets if it could be done, when Eleventh street is paved, and the motion carried.
The street committee was instructed to take up the matter with the street railway on crossing the railroad track. The committee on fire and water reported as follows:
The lights of Eugene were tested by Professor Dearborn, but the committee was not yet ready to report on the same. The bill for the test, \$6, was paid. As to certain resolutions presented by the fire department, this action was taken. The fire team was reported to be under the supervision of the chief, as to their services for fire purposes, but for all purposes such as sweeping streets, etc., it shall remain subject to the council and the street committee. The part of the resolution from the fire department asking for a small salary for the assistant chief was reported on unfavorably. The increase of the salary for the chief was favorably commented upon, and was asked to be fixed by the council. The report was adopted.
Upon motion of Councilman Henderson the fire chief's pay was raised to \$75 per year.
An advance in the salaries of the chief of police and night watchmen was proposed and Councilman Harbaugh moved to increase the salaries to \$85 per month. The vote stood: Calkins, no; Garrett, no; Henderson, no; Fisher, aye; McCrady, aye; Harbaugh, aye; Berger, aye. The motion carried.
A petition for a crosswalk over Lincoln street on the south side of West Twelfth street, was referred to the street committee.
The city attorney was instructed to publish in the papers what is to be required of candidates in the municipal election.
The proposition of an appropriation for \$500 for the city park for the coming year was referred to the finance committee.
The council unanimously agreed that the curfew ordinance should be rigidly enforced.
The \$4800 received from the county was ordered applied to paying the indebtedness of the city for paving the street intersections of Willamette street.
The sum of \$500, which was transferred from the general fund to the sewer fund, was replaced.
