DR. BROUGHER

WILL HOLD MEETINGS IN EUGENE

Rev. J. W. Brougher, the noted pastor of the White temple church of Portland, will arrive in Eugene February 24 to hold meetings in the Baptist church meeting house for the Presbyterian and Baptist churches. Dr. Brougher has just closed four years' work in Portland during which time 900 members have been added to the church, and he has preached to the largest audiences on the Pacific coast during these years. Dr. Brougher is a young man of 38 years, but today ranks with the greatest platform orators in the United States.

President Roosevelt, after hearing him, pronounced him a great preacher. He is not a professional evangelist, but a pastor who succeeds in reaching the multitudes, and week after week members are uniting with his church. Preparatory services will be held at the Baptist church beginning Sunday night, February 16, while Dr. Brougher will come February 24th. These services will be union in character and are proposed to help Eugene. A man who can command an audience week after week for four years that numbers 2000 or more will doubtless be a blessing to the numbers who will hear him in Eugene in similar work.

TOMORROW IS HIS LAST DAY
HERE—PROGRAM OF SERVICES

As a faithful minister he fears not to proclaim the Redeemer's will toward both sinner and saint, keeping back nothing that would be for the soul's welfare. For instance, if he should quote Gal. 3:26, "For ye are all sons of God, through faith, in Christ Jesus," he would probably also quote the verse immediately following: "For as many of you as were

baptized into Christ did put on Christ." He would not quote the verse having "baptized" in it as though he would place more emphasis upon that word than upon "faith," in the preceding verse, however, if he should intentionally avoid it he would be dishonoring the Savior who placed it along with faith. Baptism, as Dr. Martin teaches, without faith and repentance would not amount to anything. Those who have heard him any number of times surely know that he preaches every bit as strongly on faith, for "without faith it would be impossible to be well-pleasing to Him."—Heb. 11:6.

If the Word is ingrafted in the heart of the sinner in such a manner as to abide and develop the life of that one to the greatest extent, it is necessary that the gospel so ingrafted must be complete and hence the same one Jesus authorized and which was the one Paul preached. See Gal. 1:1-19; also 2 Tim. 4:1-2.
