# SUSLAW COUNTRY REQUIRES ATTENTION

W. E. Flisk has just returned from Mapleton, where he has been pruning his brother's orchards and putting them in shape for a thorough spraying campaign to destroy the growth of moss which affects the splendid orchards in that section. He states that there is need of thorough fruit inspection in the Siuslaw country, but Fruit Inspector Beebe informs him that it is impossible for him to personally cover the entire county, much as he would like to do so, and that he has need of deputies to assist him in the work. Mr. Flisk also reports the very bad condition several small slides occurring as the result of Sunday's rain, and much of the corduroy work being in bad condition. There is a crying necessity for more work of a permanent character on this thoroughfare, which is one of the most important leading into Eugene, and over which a great deal of trade comes to the city. Mr. Flisk thinks the county should make a special effort this year to put the Siuslaw road in better condition, since the people down the river are becoming very much discouraged and disgusted, and are making great efforts to secure a regular boat service that will turn a great deal of business in another direction if matters are not remedied soon. They are also working hard for the Carver railroad, which would give them an outlet to Corvallis.
