NIGHTSWANDER BOOSTING FOR ELECTRIC RAILWAY

WILDEAT-GLENADA ROAD PROJECTOR IN EUGENE—WILL NOW WORK FOR ELECTRIC LINE TO SIALAW

F. M. Nighswander, promoter of the Wildeat-Glenada wagon road to the mouth of the Siuslaw river, is in the city and is as enthusiastic as ever over his project, which will be completed some time during the coming summer. He has been at work on the road for the past five or six years and has had some aid from the county court, but not enough to complete it as soon as he would desire. He has spent a great deal of his own money and time on the road and when it is completed his dream of a short route to the mouth of the Siuslaw river without having to travel by boat 20 or 30 miles will have been realized. Mr. Nighswander says the next thing he will work for is a railroad from Eugene to the mouth of the river. He has interviewed several of the leading capitalists of the city and officials of the Portland, Eugene & Eastern Railway Company in regard to the matter, and he says he has received assurances from the latter that the line will be built soon. Mr. Nighswander says the people of the lower Siuslaw are now waiting for Carver's road, and they think he will beat the P. E. & E. people there if something is not done by the latter at once. He says that 15,000 bushels of apples along Sweet creek alone are lying on the ground and rotting because of no transportation facilities, to say nothing of the many thousand bushels along the Siuslaw river and other tributaries.
