GETTING THE MILITIA IN SHAPE FOR WAR

Advisers from Washington received by the officials at National Guard headquarters are to the effect that Acting Secretary of War Oliver has issued an order creating a new division in the war department, to be known as the division of military affairs. Colonel E. M. Weaver, of the coast artillery, has been named as chief of the new division. This step has been taken by the department in recognition of the growing intimacy between the regular army and the National militia, and is one of the recent moves made by the administration which shows that its importance as a factor in preparation for war and in actual strife has at last come to be appreciated.

Under the new arrangement all communications with the war department, instead of being directly with the various branches, will be made through the division of militia. This systematizes affairs and gives the state militia a distinctly better footing. While the various state organizations will in a measure remain such, they now become, as it were, a branch of the government service, and are all to be controlled in many ways by the division of militia affairs. This plan will lead to unity of improvement and action.

During the Spanish-American war, both in Cuba and the Philippines, the state militia did yeoman service, accomplishing almost as much on the field after a little experience as did the various divisions of the regular army. Since that time the war department has in many ways shown its regard for the fighting qualities of the National Guardsmen.

It is probable that in large measure the creation of the division of militia affairs was due to the conference lately held at Washington between General Oliver and other department officials and the adjutant-generals of the National Guard of California, Oregon and Washington. It is likely that the next step taken by the department will be the creation of an artillery branch of the militia. Experience has shown that in a short time the Guardsmen familiarize themselves with artillery duties at the forts so as to be able to man fortifications without the aid of regulars.

The original plan was to transfer infantrymen to this branch of the militia service, but all the adjutant-generals at the conference resisted such a move, asserting that men enlisting with the understanding that they were to see infantry service would strongly object to artillery service, which might in case of war result in their being pinned up inside fortifications for lengthy periods. Now did the commanders desire to break up the companies which had been so carefully trained in preparation for assisting the regulars on the field.—Telegram.

GENERAL NEWS IN BRIEF FORM.

At a speech before the Ellicott Club at Buffalo Saturday night Secretary Taft declared that he favored a large increase in the size of the regular army.

At Denver late Saturday afternoon the bodies of Mrs. Mary Nixon, aged 60 and her daughter, Mrs. E. N. Carter, aged 35, and the twelve-year-old son of the latter were found lying in their home in this city. A sponge was tied to each mouth, causing death by chloroform or ether. Mrs. Carter was known to have been mentally deranged and the police believe she is the author of the deed, either inducing the mother to commit suicide with her or chloroforming both the son and the mother before administering the drug to herself.
