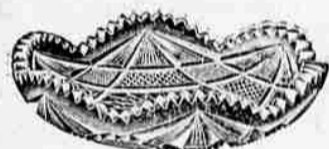

BEGIN WORK ON 'SPRINGFIELD LINE MONDAY

A. M. Utterbach, foreman of construction for the Portland, Eugene & Eastern Railway Company, informed a reporter today that he had orders to resume work on the street railway line toward Springfield next Monday. He will at the beginning place a force of twelve men and four or five teams on the work, and as it progresses further will employ a larger force. The work will begin at the present end of the line at the car barns in Fairmount where the switch has already been put in.
 L. N. Roney, who has the contract for the erection of the bridge across the Willamette at Springfield for the line, has been in conference with the company officials for the past day or so, and it is expected that work on the structure will begin within the next three or four weeks.

EUGENE AND SALEM STUDENTS TO DEBATE

Because the Salem and Eugene high school debating teams dropped out of the high school debating league early in the season is to be no obstacle to their youthful spell-binders, who are always ready and over-anxious for an opportunity to brush up the forensic field, says the Salem Statesman.
 In the way of a consolation debate, as it is called by those who are interested in the welfare of Salem's high school team, these two high schools will come together on next Friday night at the assembly room of the Salem high school to debate on the subject: "Resolved: That the members of the state legislature should be appointed by some system of proportional representation."
 The Salem lads will uphold the affirmative, while the Eugene boys will try to convince the judges of the unsoundness of such a system. It is said that Eugene will be given the time of its life because Salem will be represented by three of her ablest and most brilliant young orators, Robert Minton, Rex Turner and Howard Zimmerman.
 Debating is to commence at 8 o'clock and an admission of 25 cents will be charged, the proceeds to go toward beautifying the high school's interior.
 The Salem lads are in to win and to uphold their honor as the second high school in the state. The second semester is well under way with a total enrollment of 379 students, fifteen more than the Eugene high school's enrollment.
 No doubt the large assembly room will be packed to the doors on next Friday night to hear an interesting and able discourse, and to cheer the Salem boys on to victory.
