RAILROAD HELPS TO BOOST EUGENE

S. P. CO. PRINTS 80,000 FOLDERS ADVERTISING COLONIST RATES FROM EAST TO THIS CITY

The Southern Pacific Company has had printed 80,000 folders advertising colonist rates to Eugene during the months of March and April, and a large number have been received here for distribution through the mails by our citizens. The company will also distribute thousands along its stations in the East. On the back of the folder is printed in large type "Colonist rates to Eugene, Oregon, daily during March and April, 1908, via the Oregon Railroad and Navigation Company and Southern Pacific Company—lines in Oregon." On the inside of the folder is given the rates from principal points in the East and Middle West and a writeup of Eugene, showing its advantages as a place for homes. The folder will do a great deal toward helping to boost the city and country.

HAVE TO PAY LICENSE TO KILL COUGARS

A deputy game warden in the Franklin neighborhood made a party of fourteen who were engaged in a cougar hunt "rough up" a dollar each for hunter's licenses. This seems like an injustice, and if farmers are not allowed to protect their sheep and goats from destructive animals without paying a license, the sooner the law is repealed the better. This is lambing time, and they are easy prey, hence the organization of farmers to protect their flocks. Two of the hunters refused to be "bled" and have employed A. C. Woodcock to take the case to the supreme court if necessary. The law is silent in the matter of killing destructive animals, such as bears, cougars, coyotes and other destructive "varmints," as there is no open season for animals of this class. We have not learned of any arrests being made for not having licenses in the great coyote hunts of Eastern Oregon, but perhaps the deputy wardens of that section are not as wise as those hereabouts.—Junction Times.

SENATE INDIANS DON THEIR WAR PAINT

Washington, Feb. 27.—A highly dramatic scene in which two senators with Indian blood in their veins and the members of former Indian tribes carried on an animated and acrimonious debate, marked the proceedings in the senate today. Owen, a member of the Cherokee nation, fought by means of a wordy battle to have the word "late" placed before the designation "five civilized tribes," declaring that he wanted to record the death of the old tribal relations. Curtis of Kansas, who is part Kaw with the statement that he was under the control of the secretary of the interior and there ensued a wordy battle that entertained both the senators and the visitors. When the senate voted, it was against the contention of Owen.

McCreary spoke on the currency bill and after further consideration of the Indian bill, the senate adjourned.
