MARCH TERM CIRCUIT COURT IN SESSION

MANY CASES ON DOCKET THIS TIME AND TERM WILL BE A LONG ONE

GRAND JURY CHOSEN TO LOOK INTO SEVERAL CRIMINAL CASES AT HAND--MANY CIVIL CASES ARE ACTED UPON AT TODAY'S SESSION OF COURT

The regular March term of circuit court was convened this morning by Judge Harris. More than the usual number of cases are on the docket this term for the reason that the business that piled up during the holidays, caused by the financial flurry, when no court could be held, has not been touched. A short term was held in January, but very little was done and it adjourned a couple of days after convening. There are 122 cases on the docket this time and several have been filed since the docket was printed and others will come up before court adjourns.

Grand Jury Chosen
A grand jury as follows was chosen this afternoon: W. H. Key, R. E. Gross, Wm. Eadness, John W. Harms, E. F. Judkins, H. A. Macy and R. R. Bay. Landers was chosen as foreman. After receiving the judge's instructions the jury retired and with District Attorney McFadden is now deliberating on the several criminal cases at hand.

The case of the state vs. Fred Lemley, charged with the sale of liquor at Springfield in violation of the local option law, came up for trial this afternoon. The jury chosen is as follows: H. E. Morris, Clarence Koon, J. M. Gearhart, Rufus Robertson, Frank H. Holland, M. W. Pennington, P. D. Newell, L. B. Rossman, E. W. Michael, J. J. Peplet, J. B. Hill, M. B. Stone. 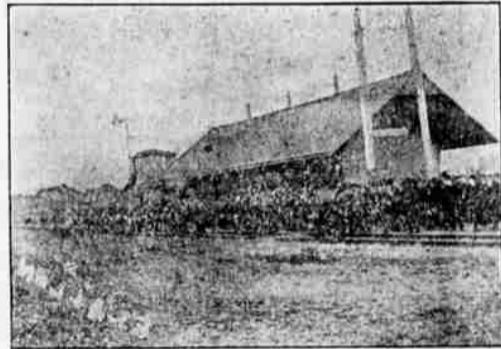

MOVING OLD DEPOT TO MAKE ROOM FOR NEW

B. POYNER HAS CONTRACT FOR WORK, WHICH HAS ALREADY COMMENCED -- OLD BUILDING WILL BE MOVED TO POINT OPPOSITE FREIGHT DEPOT

B. Poyner has the contract for moving the old passenger depot to make room for the new one which is to be built immediately, and today he began the work. Timbers and the necessary apparatus to move the building were delivered at the depot grounds and the jack screws were placed in position today, the actual work of moving the building to begin tomorrow. While the new depot is being built the old one will stand directly across the main track from the freight depot. The new structure will be built where the old one now stands, except that it will be thirty feet from the inside rail of the main track.
