## WILL PLANT PALMS ON EAST ELEVENTH STREET

IMPROVEMENT CLUB WILL ORDER MANY PLANTS FROM CALIFORNIA AT ONCE

WILL PLANT THEM BETWEEN CURBING AND SIDEWALK—WHEN IMPROVEMENTS ARE COMPLETED THOROUGHFARE WILL BE MOST BEAUTIFUL IN OREGON.

At the meeting of the East Eleventh Street Improvement Club at the Commercial Club quarters last night it was decided to plant Dracena palms in the parking between the curb line and the sidewalk the entire length of East Eleventh street. A committee, headed by M. F. Griggs, was appointed to take orders for the palms, which will come from California and thrive in this climate. S. H. Friendly has two fine specimens in his yard, but no one is to be planted on Eleventh street will be of a different variety and have a different appearance. Orders were given for thirty of the plants last night. Each will cost 65 cents, plus the freight to get them here. As each property owner will have to purchase only a few the improvement will be very inexpensive. The sample of the palm which was received a day or so ago has been planted at the corner of East Eleventh and Patterson streets, and may be seen there by any one who wishes to place an order for them.

When the pavement is completed the parking improved and the palms set out along the entire length of the thoroughfare, East Eleventh street will be the most beautiful street in the state of Oregon. All of these improvements will be completed during the summer, if present plans are carried out.

The matter of porch lights for the residences on the street was also discussed. The club will take up the matter with the Willamette Valley Company, and if a rate of 50 cents per month can be secured, practically every house on the street will have a light burning on the front porch all night. This will also improve the appearance of the street wonderfully at night. Already there are a number of the residents along the street who are burning their porch lights during the fore part of the night.


