\$100,000 DAMAGE SUIT AGAINST S. P. BEING TRIED

M. J. DOYLE IS PLAINTIFF IN BIG CASE IN CIRCUIT COURT AGAINST RAILROAD

JURY GOES TO DIVIDE ON SPECIAL TRAIN TO VIEW SCENE OF ACCIDENT WHERE DOYLE LOST BOTH LEGS BY BEING RUN OVER BY LOCOMOTIVE

Today's session of the circuit court has been taken up entirely with the trial of the case of M. J. Doyle vs. the Southern Pacific Company for \$100,000 damages. Doyle, it will be remembered, was run over by a train at Divide, in the southern part of Lane county, a year or two ago and both legs were severed from his body. At the time of the occurrence he was foreman of a gang of Greeks who were employed in building tracks there, and as the train came bearing upon the Greeks, without warning, he attempted to save the lives of a number of them by helping them off the track. In doing so he was caught by the locomotive and run over. He was at once taken to Portland and placed in a hospital, where he hovered between life and death for a long time. He is now using cork legs and appeared that way in court today.

Doyle's attorneys are Bennett & Slonoff and Slonoff & Adams, of The Dalles, and A. C. Woodcock, of Eugene. These are among the state's brightest lawyers. The railroad company is also represented by several attorneys in the persons of W. D. Fenton, who has been general counsel for the company for years, R. A. Lelter, another railroad attorney, and J. M. Pipes, the company's local attorney.

A great deal of time was taken up with the work of selecting the jury and each man was examined carefully. Both sides are well satisfied with the men as finally selected, the jury consisting of the following:

P. D. Newell, Charles Koon, H. B. Dunlap, P. W. Michael, Palmer Ayers, R. Y. Brown, L. B. Brown, J. J. Bolter, J. N. Cole, J. M. Garant, Rufus Reberstein.

Jury Taken to Divide.
After it had been completed this afternoon the jury, accompanied by the lawyers in the case, the witnesses and court officials, boarded a special train, furnished by the railroad company, and were taken to Divide to view the scene of the accident.

Ernest Coleman, who was yesterday indicted for selling liquor, late yesterday afternoon pleaded guilty and was fined \$75.
