COUNTY COURT WILL GIVE BOUNTY ON VARMINT SCALPS

COMMISSIONERS' COURT HEEDS PETITION OF SOUTH LANE COUNTY COYOTE CLUB AND WILL HELP EXTERMINATE COYOTES, WOLVES AND COUGARS

Hereafter a bounty of \$2.50 will be paid on scalps of coyotes, wolves, cougars and like animals that prey upon the stock of Lane county. The county commissioners' court yesterday made an order to that effect, upon petition of the South Lane County Coyote Club. The club consists of 72 leading farmers and stockmen residing at Grasswell, Walker, Cottage Grove and the respective communities and has paid by assessment over \$100 in bounties during the past year yet, the petition declares, wolves and coyotes do not seem to diminish in numbers, but continue to make destructive raita on the farmers' flocks.

Since the bounty on these wild animals was abolished several years ago, they have increased very materially and have proven a source of great annoyance to the farmers, especially to those who live near the mountains. Before the bounty was good living by killing wolves, coyotes and cougars, receiving \$2.50 for each scalp from the county.
