BECKWITH WILL ERECT REINFORCED CONCRETE BUILDING

WILL COVER SPACE BETWEEN CORNER BLOCK AND ALLEY IN REAR WITH ONE-STORY STRUCTURE

OTTO KAUFMANN, CONFECTIONER, WILL OCCUPY ENTIRE BUILDING--WORK ON STRUCTURE TO COMMENCE AS SOON AS OLD BUILDINGS CAN BE DISPOSED OF

L. O. Beckwith, the capitalist, who built the Beckwith block next to The Guard building, has decided to at once erect a one-story reinforced concrete business building in the rear of the block mentioned.

Mr. Beckwith this morning showed to a Guard reporter rough plans for the proposed new building. It will have a frontage on East Seventh street of 80 feet. It will be divided into two large rooms, the west room having a frontage of 35 feet and extending back 60 feet, and the east room, the one next to the alley, will front 40 feet on East Seventh street and extend clear back to Park street, 114 feet.

Back of the west room of the new building will be four wood sheds each 10x15 feet. Between the old building and the new there will be a hallway five feet wide to allow Polders & Davis, who occupy one of the rooms of the old building, to get their goods in from East Seventh street. There will also be a space 1 1/2 feet wide from the rear of The Guard building to Park street for the same purpose.

Otto Kaufmann, who occupies the corner room of the old building with his confectionery store and lunch room, and the two frame buildings in the rear with his candy factory and for a store room, will occupy both rooms in the new building. His kitchen, which is now located in the rear part of the old building, will be moved to the new and the sales room will thereby be greatly enlarged.

This will be the first reinforced concrete building to be erected in Eugene. Mr. Beckwith realizes that brick is going to be very scarce and hard to get this year, and not wishing to delay the construction of the building on that account, decided upon concrete. It is said to be about as cheap, anyway.

NEW DISTRICT OF FOREST RESERVE

WILLAMETTE DIVISION, WITH HEADQUARTERS AT EUGENE, CREATED WITH SUPERVISOR C. R. SEITZ IN CHARGE

On March 15 a new district of the national forest reserve will be established, with Eugene as headquarters and Supervisor C. R. Seitz, who has been stationed here for nearly a year, as head of the division. The new division includes all of the territory north of the forks of the Willamette and Deschutes and that south of the north line of township 13, taking in both slopes of the Cascades. It will be known as the Willamette division of the national forest. Supervisor Seitz will then have charge of all the territory from Tillamook on the north to Coos Bay on the south and from the coast to a point same distance on the east side of the summit of the Cascades. He will go to Roseburg in a few days to transfer the papers and records from there to Eugene, and will enlarge his office, which is located in the Beckwith block. The force of the office will also be increased, two deputy supervisors making their headquarters here.

The alarm brought out a large crowd of people on the streets, as this was the first fire in several months.

FREIGHT DEPOT WILL STAND WEST OF STOCK YARDS

The old passenger depot reached its destination, directly across the street from its old location, today, and will remain there until the new building is completed, after which it will be moved to the western end of the yards, where it will be combined with the old freight depot and a large freighthouse made out of the two buildings. The freight depot will stand somewhere west of the stock yards, either where the turn table is now located or on the tract beyond Charnelton street, said to have recently been secured by the company. The old Smith & Hall warehouse is now being fitted up for a temporary freight house, and a platform is being built at the east end of the building to facilitate the handling of freight. Work of moving the old freight depot will begin at once, so that the passing track, now under construction, may be finished soon, the building now standing in the line surveyed for the track.

BIDS FOR HIGH SCHOOL ADDITION TO BE ASKED FOR

WILL BE BUILT DURING VACATION AND READY FOR OCCUPANCY NEXT YEAR

The regular meeting of the Eugene school board was held last evening. Among the important matters up for discussion was that of a proposition of the fair committee to sell the district a half block of ground for a new school building at the corner of West Ninth and Monroe streets. The matter was referred to the proper committee, which was given power to act.

The bids for furnishing wood for the district for the next year were opened, but the contract was not let for the reason that all members of the board were not present.

The building committee was instructed to advertise for bids for the new addition to the high school. It is expected that the work will be done during the vacation season so that the addition will be ready for occupancy the first of the next school year.

The committee was also instructed to look into the matter of proper exits at all of the school buildings so that in case of fire the children might leave the building without loss of life.

Illustration of Cutting Guide for Pattern No. 2275, showing the correct way of laying out the pattern on the material, and how to use the least quantity of goods.

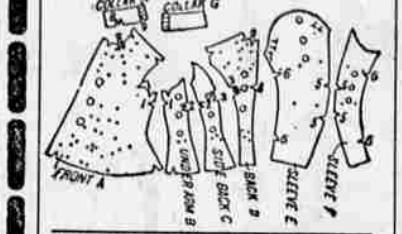


Illustration of Construction Guide for Pattern No. 2275, showing how to sew the different parts together, etc.
