ELECTRIC AIR LINE RAILWAY PROVES SWINDLE

Chicago, March 7.—The financial troubles of the Chicago-New York Electric Company, which was organized two years ago to build an electric road between Chicago and New York, have come to a head. David Kabacker and seven other stockholders applied to the circuit court at La Porte, Ind., for the appointment of a receiver for the company and for the Co-operative Construction Company, the Western Securities Company, the Goshen, South Bend and Chicago Railway Company, the Gary & Indianapolis Company, and the Hancock Company.

It is understood that other stockholders, owning a quarter of a million dollars' worth of the stock, are represented in the action. Judge Richter, after hearing the application appointed George F. Mull, an Indianapolis attorney, as temporary receiver. He immediately filed a bond for \$50,000 and took possession of the property in Indiana, this being estimated to be worth \$500,000.

The complaint contains 10,000 words and reveals the inner workings of a spectacular scheme started by a number of promoters, and many facts hitherto unknown are made public.

The Air Line Company started out with a capital of \$1,000,000. This was finally increased to \$200,000,000. The officers are accused of using the United States mails to defraud. Little was done in the way of actual construction, the activities of the company being confined to a 12-mile electric interurban road running out of LaPorte.

WOOLWINE AND DOW EACH GIVEN JAIL SENTENCE

Clyde Woolwine, who had previously pleaded guilty to the charge of fornication, was sentenced by Judge Harris, of the circuit court, to serve six months in the county jail and to pay the costs of the prosecution.

Allen Dow, indicted by the grand jury one day last week for selling liquor at Coburg, this morning entered a plea of guilty and was given thirty days in the county jail and the costs of the prosecution were assessed against him.

TEN OF CREW DIED OF EXPOSURE

San Francisco, March 7.—The schooner Casarina, which arrived today from Plover Cove, Alaska, brought the news that the schooner John F. Miller was driven ashore during the gale on January 3, at Ilatook Peninsula, Unalaska island, and broke in two.

So far as is known ten of the crew, including the cook, died of exposure, and it is believed that at least twenty-five of the survivors are still on the peninsula.

Two of the crew put out in a dory and reached Sand Point after five days.

The light-house keeper pressed the schooner Martha into service, and dispatched her to the scene. The Martha had not returned up to the time the Casarina sailed.

COMPERS CALLS LABOR MEN FOR A CONFERENCE

Washington, March 7.—The far-reaching character of the recent decision of the supreme court of the United States, affecting labor organizations, has led President Compers, of the American Federation of Labor, to call a meeting of the executive council of the Federation in this city in the early part of the week beginning March 15. The call expresses the hope that the executive officers of the international trade unions of America will meet with the executive council on March 18, "there to consult with and take such action as the importance and merits of the subject herein dealt with may be considered and determined as setting forth the position and demands of labor."

WIRELESS MESSAGE FROM BIG FLEET

San Diego, March 8.—At 12:30 this morning the Point Loma (Cal.) wireless station received a dispatch for the navy department from Admiral Evans aboard his flagship, the Connecticut, which, with the remainder of the battleships comprising the Atlantic squadron, left Calao, Peru, for Magdalena bay February 29. The Point Loma operator was unable to determine the location of the Connecticut, as the signals, which doubtless would have indicated the ship's whereabouts, were indistinguishable. Nothing could be learned as to the contents of the message.

FALLS HEIR TO TEN MILLIONS

Worcester, Mass., March 9.—John T. Bower, secretary of the Y. M. C. A. here, has been notified that he is heir to the fortune of \$10,000,000 left by his uncle, Thomas Walker, who died at Melbourne, Australia. He says he will retain the secretaryship in the local branch association.

PROMINENT CHINAMAN VICTIM OF HIGHBANDERS

Portland, March 7.—Lee Dai Hoy, a member of the Quong Sang Wa Co., was shot and fatally wounded tonight by a hatchet man who had been imported from San Francisco for the purpose of killing Lee. The trouble is said to have been due to internal dissensions in the Bow Wong tong. The trouble is of a financial nature, according to the statements of other Chinamen. They say there were two factions of the Bow Wong tong, one of these being headed by Lee. The other faction is said to charge that Lee refused to account for some money of the company, which this faction asserts he had in his possession. They also say Lee's friends are on the war-path tonight, and according to the custom of the race, will exact reprisals on the opposing faction, probably before morning.

Lee died from his wounds at 11 o'clock tonight.
