ACTUAL WORK ON NEW DEPOT BEGAN TO-DAY

The actual work of constructing the Southern Pacific Company's new passenger depot in this city began this afternoon when a force of men was put to work excavating for the concrete foundation. It was generally supposed that the building would have a basement for the heating plant, but the plans call for a room in one end of the building for the furnace. The building will be 32x144 feet in dimensions. The sand and other materials for the concrete will be delivered tomorrow, and the work of laying the material will immediately thereafter begin.

JURY AWARDS DOYLE \$45,000 DAMAGES

cut it down to a lower figure than at last agreed upon. The trial has been long, beginning last Thursday morning. A greater part of the first day was occupied in securing a jury and the testimony was long and some of it tedious. A number of Greeks who were working under Doyle at the time of the accident testified and their testimony had to be repeated by an interpreter, thereby taking up more time than the testimony given by others. Both sides were represented by some of the ablest attorneys in the state. The railroad company had W. D. Fenton, R. A. Leiter, well-known corporation attorneys of Portland, and J. M. Pipes, the company's local counsel, while Doyle was represented by Judge A. S. Bennett and Attorney Slinnot, of The Dalles, and A. C. Woodcock, of Eugene. Judge Bennett is said to be one of the best attorneys in a case of this kind on the coast and it is probably due to his splendid argument before the jury that the plaintiff was awarded as much as he was. The case will probably be appealed to the supreme court by the railroad company. The defendant was given 20 days to file a motion for a new trial. The jury in the case was as follows: P. D. Newell, Clarence Koon, H. B. Dunlap, E. W. Michael, Palmer Ayers, R. Y. Porter, L. B. Rossman, P. J. Bolan, J. N. Cole, J. M. Gearhardt, Rufus Robertson. Enter Plea of Not Guilty. Andy Taylor and Wm. L. Ford, who had been indicted for the illegal sale of liquor, appeared in court this morning and entered pleas of not guilty. Taylor's attorney is C. M. Klasinger and Ford's is L. M. Travis. The trials will come up within a few days. Ernest Coleman, who last week was fined \$75 for the same offense, had been indicted by the grand jury for perjury, alleged to have been committed in connection with his case. His attorneys, Charles A. Hardy and L. Bilyen, filed a demurrer to the indictment. Hoffman vs. Scott Case Up. The case of Mrs. Eugenia Hoffman vs. Duncan Scott, to recover \$4000 which the plaintiff alleges she gave the defendant to invest for her, was called this morning and the following jury chosen: M. B. Stone, J. W. Pollock, J. M. Gearhart, H. B. Dunlap, L. B. Rossman, E. W. Michael, Rufus Robertson, F. R. Wetherbee, R. D. Hawley, Palmer Ayers, R. Y. Porter, W. L. Wheeler.

This case is the one, it will be remembered, in which Scott alleges that Mrs. Hoffman gave him the money with which to buy "green goods" at Los Angeles. Scott claiming to have been robbed by the bunch artists, but also claims that it was his money which they took and not Mrs. Hoffman's. The case was tried at one of the terms of court last year and this is the second trial. J. M. Pipes, George A. Pipes, of this city, and M. L. Pipes, of Portland, are attorneys for Mrs. Hoffman and L. Bilyen, of this city, and A. S. Bennett, of The Dalles, for Scott.

Divorce Granted. Judge Harris has granted a divorce in the case of Sarah E. Parmenter vs. David B. Parmenter. This is the case wherein Parmenter married a second wife before he was divorced from his first, and wife No. 1, learning of the circumstance, immediately sued to be free of him.

Professor Shafer's OREGON HISTORY. London, March 9.—The inner history of what is known as the Oregon question, which brought America and England to the verge of war in the middle of the last century, is about to be given to the public. Professor Joseph Shafer of the University of Oregon, who has contributed several books to the history of the Northwest, is now in London gathering the material. He has already had access to the correspondence on the subject in the archives of the State Department at Washington and the American Embassy in London and is now going over the papers in the Colonial and Foreign offices.

Secures Private Dispatches. What will, however, probably furnish the most interesting detail is the private correspondence of Lord Aberdeen, at the time Secretary for Foreign Affairs for Great Britain, and this has been placed at the disposal of Professor Shafer by Baron Stanmore, fourth son of that statesman.

The question that has always puzzled the students of the history of the Northwest is why Lord Aberdeen, after instructing the British Minister that England would insist upon the
