RATE WAR ON COAST STEAMSHIPS.

People will now have the opportunity of going from Portland to San Francisco by the water route, and living in luxury at the same time, at about as cheaply as they can remain at home, for the San Francisco & Portland Steamship Co. has declared a rate war which begins today. The first class fare on the Rose City and Senator has been cut from \$15 to \$10 and second class from \$10 to \$5. It is the biggest cut made by any steamship line on the Coast for years. To retain its share of the patronage it means that the North Pacific Steamship Company, owner and operator of the Resolute and George W. Elder, will be obliged to meet the cut. The fare charged by this line has always been the same as that exacted by the Harriman people—Portland Telegram.

COOKE CALLS DAY HIRING OF TRUST

Brandon, Vt., March 10.—Hiring of the oil trust is but one of the pet names Rev. George Cooke called Chancellor Day today in a statement of his attitude regarding the charges he has brought against the chancellor. Rev. Cooke's statement is in the nature of a defense of himself and his stand from the insinuation publicly expressed by the chancellor since the charges which may result in his expulsion from the church were brought. Rev. Cooke says: "The reply of Chancellor Day to my charges reveals the thin and shabby texture of his defense. That he has sold his character and influence to the Standard Oil trust is so plain that he who runs may read. His statement that 'Cooke is something of a joke to those who know him, and that he seems to have a mania to bring charges against some one' is childish and absurd on the face of it. 'The church has been scandalized and annihilated long enough by Day's venomous attacks on President Roosevelt, and there is a widespread feeling that he ought to be expelled from the church, so that he alone will be responsible for his utterances.'"
