IMPROVEMENT AT B.-K.'S. SAWMILL AT SPRINGFIELD

A few weeks ago it will be remembered that the News made mention of the fact that the Booth-Kelly Company were making some extensive and substantial improvements in their Springfield plant. In the following issue of the Western Oregon we are called to task for even daring to mention that this company is making improvements. In his article he doubts the truthfulness of our statement and says "It is hard to credit that the company is doubtless making repairs and possibly installing new parts to replace worn-out machinery." He says, "True, all mills are doing overhauling work but there is no increase of capacity." That's all folly, but, no doubt, comes from some jealous mood because the little mills at Cottage Grove are not making similar improvements. The information that was given in the News columns was authentic and as proof that this company is doing more than merely repairing the broken parts, we also informed that a contract has been let to the Frazer Iron Works for the making of a log kicker for the Booth-Kelly Lumber Company at Springfield. This is a big piece of machinery, and when completed will weigh over 7000 pounds and will cost the company in the neighborhood of \$2500. They have also installed within the past week a \$2000 turning lathe which has been placed in their blacksmith shop. These are only minor improvements that have already been made. That the Booth-Kelly mill at Springfield will be one of the best on the coast is assured and those who are skeptical in their belief are at liberty to visit the yard and see for themselves what is being done. The News has not lost faith in Springfield or the Booth-Kelly Lumber Co. and we believe that we have the best town in the state of Oregon for its size. We respectfully invite the editor of the Western Oregon to visit our plant and compare notes.—News.

ROSEBURG RAISES BIG BOOSTER FUND

Roseburg, March 13.—Roseburg last night received a powerful impetus to its boosting movement from the oratory of Tom Richardson, who spoke to 500 citizens at the courthouse. Mr. Richardson not only created the greatest enthusiasm ever exhibited in any meeting of its kind held in this city, but did more—something that was considered a task requiring weeks of time. He raised among the audience a monthly subscription list of \$500 to defray the cost of an aggressive advertising campaign to secure for the city and Douglas county its full share of the immigration into Oregon this year. Although this sum was declared by Mr. Richardson to be as large as that pledged for such purpose by any other town of similar size in the state, it will in all probability be increased fully one-third by the end of this week. A number of citizens who were unable to attend last night's meeting stated beforehand that they would contribute their share toward an advertising fund, and when these have originated their subscriptions Roseburg will be assured of the handsome sum of about \$10,000 to defray the cost of one year's publicity work.
