BUILDING LINE EAST OF SOUTHERN PACIFIC TRACK

WORK ON ELECTRIC RAILROAD TO SPRINGFIELD ONCE MORE RESUMED TODAY—NEW PASSING TRACK TO BE PUT IN ON EAST ELEVENTH STREET TO REPLACE OLD ONE

A good-sized force of men started to work on the electric line east of the railroad in Fairmount this afternoon and the line to Springfield will be rushed to completion. The frogs for the crossing with the Southern Pacific Company's track have not yet arrived, but they are expected soon and will at once be put in so that cars can run over the new portions of the line as fast as they are completed. Cars are now running to the railroad track, and if the frogs arrive at once, as expected, they will be running to the city limits inside of two weeks.

There will be considerable trestle work to be built along the bottom into the Campbell & Walker hop yards. The work of building the bridge across the river will be begun as soon as all danger of high water is past.

New Switch on Eleventh Street. The Guard a few days ago announced that a new passing track would soon be built on East Eleventh street to replace the one now in use for the reason that at present the cars have to turn at too sharp an angle and a derailment is probable at any time unless the cars are run at a very low rate of speed while making the turn. The switches now in use are not what the company ordered, but as they were the only ones available it was necessary to put them in or do without. The new passing track will extend almost the entire length of the block.

The occasion will be one of great importance to militiamen and the local officers and enlisted men are making great preparations to entertain the visitors. The officers of the colonel's staff and of the two companies here are planning a banquet for the governor and the visiting officers to be held in the reception rooms of the armory after the presentation ceremonies.

Governor Chamberlain will present the colors to the regiment in person, and it is expected that he will deliver quite an address at the time. After the flag presentation the Eugene Military band will give a concert and dance. This affair was planned before it was announced that the flag presentation would be made on that date, and after a consultation between the management of the band and the militia officers it was agreed to hold both the same night.
