MAHON-RANKIN CASE GONE TO JURY

LENGTHY TRIAL TO RECOVER TIMBER SALE COMMISSION COMES TO END—DIVORCE GRANTED

The case of H. C. Mahon vs. M. B. Rankin, in which Mahon sued Rankin to recover over \$49,000 as commission on the sale of large tracts of timber land in Lane and other counties of Oregon, came to a close this afternoon and is now in the hands of the jury. The trial lasted several days and has attracted more than ordinary attention because of the large amount sued for.

Divorce Granted.
Judge Harris today granted a decree in the divorce case of Lillie M. Hart vs. James H. Hart.

In the case of Jordan Purvine, trustee, vs. Star Consolidated Mining Company, foreclosure, a decree was granted because of the failure to make up to proof of service and the same was not completely verified.

A disclaimer in the last week's issue of the Oregonian, regarding the sale of the district attorney, Coleman, is now serving a term in the county jail for selling liquor at Springfield and the grand jury afterward indicted him for perjury, alleged to have been committed by him in the case.
