TONOPAH GOLD STRIKE OF \$200,000 PER TON

Tonopah, Nev., March 14.—Inhabitants of this city and vicinity are excited over another rich gold strike that has been made here, this time in the Round Mountain camp. Reports from there today state that it is the biggest of the kind ever struck in this district. Eight inches of ore, practically pure gold, was struck at a depth of 100 feet. It is estimated it will run \$200,000 to the ton.
