NAT C. GOODWIN QUILTS STAGE TO BE A MINER

New York, March 17.—Telegraphic advices just received here by Nat C. Goodwin, the comedian, upon the bona fide character of his gold mining properties in the Rawhide, Nev., mining district have persuaded him to abandon the stage, temporarily at least, and to devote his energies to the mines, where he intends to take personal supervision of the mines.

So great was Mr. Goodwin's desire to begin this superintendence that he would have left Broadway, the playhouse and play upon the spur of the moment had he not felt restrained to hold his theatrical company together until he could be released from his present contracts, which include one week more in New York and three weeks in Chicago.

This is the telegram which Mr. Goodwin received in his dressing room at the Garrick theatre, and which upon reading decided him that he could devote his energies to greater pecuniary advantage by taking personal charge of the mines.
