**GRANITE OVER ENTIRE DEPOT GROUNDS**

SEVERAL CARLOADS ARRIVED LAST NIGHT AND MANY MORE WILL FOLLOW EACH DAY

Among the numerous improvements being made and to be made this summer at the Southern Pacific depot grounds in this city is the spreading of Grants Pass decomposed granite over the entire yards, from the place where the main passing track will join the main track near Madison street to the extreme east end of the yards. The first five car loads of the material arrived last night and were unloaded west of the Eugene Planing Mill Company's plant. Four or five car loads are expected to arrive each day until the work is completed. This will be a great improvement in the yards. All the low places where water stands in the winter time will be filled up and after the granite is packed like that at the passenger depot platform the yards will present a much better appearance than ever before. Several carloads of gravel, also for filling in purposes, arrived this morning.

Work on the foundation for the new depot is progressing rapidly and will soon be completed. The first car load of brick has arrived from Portland and has been unloaded. This was not pressed brick, as stated, but the ordinary kind, which will be used for the inside part of the walls of the building.
